

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




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SHAPING A BETTER WORLD

They will provide vital insights into the industries of the future, supporting businesses and testing new approaches that give data meaning.


They address societal challenges by bringing together the private sector, central and local governments, and the creativity and problem-solving capabilities of our global experts.

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING INNOVATION CENTRE (AMIC)

AMIC is a collaborative powerhouse of advanced manufacturing that will empower Northern Ireland industry to be more innovative, productive, and sustainable. AMIC is live and growing a team of engineers and specialist capabilities as it works on research and innovation projects with industry across the region.

Equipped with an expert engineering team and state-of-the-art facilities, AMIC is driving economic growth and industrial transformation, advancing innovations in areas such as smart manufacturing, automation, and sustainable production technologies.

Delivered by Queen's in partnership with Antrim & Newtownabbey Borough Council, Ulster University, and industry, AMIC is already operational and working with industry across the region; its flagship facility, the Factory of the Future, is set to open in 2026, offering expertise and capabilities to ensure Northern Ireland remains a leader in the advanced manufacturing sector.





iREACH HEALTH

iREACH Health is a new integrated clinical research centre led by Queen's in partnership with Belfast Health and Social Care Trust and Health and Social Care Research and Development Division.

Opening in 2027 beside the Belfast City Hospital, this purpose-built innovation centre will co-locate partners in the clinical research ecosystem, helping to accelerate medical breakthroughs and support the growth of clinical research in Northern Ireland.

This centre will revolutionise Northern Ireland's clinical trial capability to be more effective, efficient, and interconnected. Through iREACH Health our goal is to position NI as a region of choice for clinical trials and research so that we can accelerate innovations into the health and care system for patient benefit. Through this generational infrastructure investment, we will transform NI's clinical trials ecosystem, building on research excellence and growing research capacity to further enhance our position as a global leader in Life and Health Sciences (LHS).



MOMENTUM ONE ZERO

Momentum One Zero is building on proven research and industry capability in cybersecurity, wireless innovation, and artificial intelligence to tackle some of the world's most complex challenges.

Combining industry and academic expertise at its innovation hub in Titanic Quarter, Momentum One Zero is delivering solutions through the application of secure, connected intelligence across many sectors, including health, agri-food, net zero, and fintech.

The innovation centre is working with industry - locally and globally - to thrive in a digitally connected future, with access to advanced tools, technologies, and new approaches.

Future-Ready (Postgraduate Taught) is a specific award for Master's students and is recognised by a range of employers.

As well as developing research expertise in a subject discipline, postgraduate research students can develop a range of skills transferable beyond research degrees to both academic and non-academic careers. The Future-Ready Award (Postgraduate Research) provides official recognition of skills and assists researchers in demonstrating them to employers.

NEW CENTRES OF LEARNING

Our commitment to excellence in teaching and research is reflected in our facilities.

At the KN Cheung SK Chin InterSim Centre, students across health and social care disciplines benefit from immersive, simulation-based education. The centre includes a hospital ward and multi-sensory simulation 'Cave' to replicate real clinical settings.

Award-winning and internationally recognised, the School of Biological Sciences serves 750 students and 170 staff, while the Wellcome-Wolfson Institute for Experimental Medicine stands as a global hub of excellence.

The recently expanded Computer Science Building offers computer labs, project spaces, breakout spaces and a Student Hub to encourage collaboration.

The £20m School of Law boasts a Moot Court Room and the Herbert Smith Freehills Student Hub to nurture the next generation of lawyers.

The School of Mathematics and Physics provides a dedicated space for teaching, including lecture and group-study rooms, a student social area, computer facilities and a state-of-the-art physics laboratory.

THE McCLAY LIBRARY

Designed by architects who inspired libraries at Yale and Harvard, we've invested over £50m in the McClay Library to blend the best features of a traditional library with the latest technology. It is the perfect study space, with access to extensive book and journal collections, reader spaces, quiet study and group study areas, computer workstations, computer and media services, IT training rooms and a cafe.

The Wireless Campus Project is a £1.93m investment programme providing a world-class connectivity service across the university through more than 2,000 access points. It gives you access to the resources you need anytime, anywhere.

QUEEN'S SPORT

There is a thriving sports culture at Queen's with over 50 sports clubs. The Physical Education Centre (PEC) includes state-of-the-art fitness training and weights areas, four studios, a 25m swimming and diving pool, two multipurpose sports halls, a martial arts area, two climbing walls, eight squash courts and two handball courts. Membership of Queen's Sport is included in all Queen's student accommodation packages.

THE LANGUAGE CENTRE

Our Language Centre provides classes in 17 languages and self-study resources in more than 80 languages. It hosts language and cultural events throughout the year, along with a library of resources to help you gain skills in a foreign language.

Academic English Service

The Academic English Service provides embedded courses on English and academic skills for international students across all 15 Schools at Queen's, at both postgraduate taught and postgraduate research level. These courses are carefully tailored and timed to ensure all students have the opportunity to reach their full potential on their university programmes.

The courses are co-designed by academic staff at Queen's and the Queen's University Belfast International Study Centre, with specialist teachers of English for Academic Purposes delivering support. Our provision combines the academic skills you need with targeted English language development, mapped to your discipline and assignments. Students also benefit from one-to-one consultations.

With over 95% of students reporting improved academic performance and 97% overall satisfaction, our Academic English Service team helps students gain confidence and excel in their studies at Queen's.

No matter what you are studying, we have something to offer. These English language and academic skills support classes are free to all international fee-paying students at Queen's.



ACADEMIES

Queen's Sport works with student clubs, governing bodies and alumni networks to develop our sporting academies. Currently there are five academies – Rugby, GAA, Soccer, Rowing and Hockey – with more than 35 teams and 600 students competing each year as part of our Performance Pathway.

From innovative solutions to cancer care, critical breakthroughs in wireless and cloud technologies, to addressing issues of fundamental rights, equality and social justice, our research is changing people's lives for the better.

Research is a Global Endeavour, and today our research culture is primed by investment in areas of research strength, particularly our translational expertise, working across disciplines and sectors to address local and global challenges, incorporating UN Sustainable Development Goals.

As our cohort of global collaborators continues to grow, so does our scope of ambition, allied with the skills and capabilities to tackle global and local challenges. Curiosity, endeavour, and enterprise informs our global research agenda and the challenges ahead; excellence ensures that our research activities resonate widely; and we strive to excel through integrity, rigour, and ambition.

Informed by a track record of excellence and an ambition for the future, our strategic research themes focus on:

Colleagues across our schools and faculties are dedicated to deepening our understanding of diseases and developing solutions and treatments for them. Our expertise in conducting clinical trials and our world-leading facilities in cancer and precision medicine research are a testament to the breakthroughs that Queen's research has facilitated over the decades. We are also leading the way in developing strategies and initiatives that mitigate against the worst effects of illness, and that act as preventative agents to illnesses developing in the first place. A strong public health approach, focusing on community well-being, aligned with a commitment to social justice drives our pledge to improve health outcomes which can reduce inequalities across society.

'The Recovery Package': Supportive Cancer Care for Patients and Families

We are transforming supportive care for cancer survivors and their families through the development of a new model for follow up care termed 'The Recovery Package'.

In 2010, our researchers carried out a study which found that cancer survivors, 2-15 years post-treatment, reported significantly poorer health than the general population in terms of physical functioning, emotional functioning, general health perception and social functioning.

To date, the initiative, which includes a holistic assessment, a treatment summary record, an individualised pathway and rapid entry back into the system, has improved the cancer recovery experience for over 10,000 patients.

The research resulted in the implementation of a new model of cancer patient follow up, termed 'The Recovery Package'.

Transforming the Lives of People with Cystic Fibrosis

We are improving the lives of thousands of people with Cystic Fibrosis by leading on the clinical development of treatments that address the underlying genetic deficit.

These transformative therapies improve lung health and have underpinned the regulatory approval and marketing of four breakthrough Cystic Fibrosis therapies.

The most recent trials successfully demonstrated that a combination of drugs can treat up to 90 per cent of people with Cystic Fibrosis by addressing the underlying cause of their disease.



Destroying Cyanobacteria and their Toxins: An in-reservoir treatment system

Cyanotoxins are toxic substances produced by bloom-forming cyanobacteria, a major problem worldwide for water contamination. Cyclic hepatotoxins and microcystins, if consumed, are associated with liver cancer and can be fatal causing serious liver haemorrhaging.

Traditional water treatment methods are relatively ineffective at removing cyanobacterial toxins from water. However, the application of semiconductor photocatalysis is a novel and effective method for removing these compounds from water.

Our researchers have been taking this beyond the lab with an in-lake photocatalytic treatment process. A successful prototype system was successfully deployed in Brazil in October 2019, the unit capable of removing the cyanobacteria in-situ. Further refinement of the unit will see it deployed for in-situ water treatment applications.

The Economy

The economy of the next 100 years will be a necessarily different one to the economy we experience today. The ongoing climate crisis, our fossil fuel dependency, raw material shortages and the possibility of supply chain disruptions call for innovative, responsible and sustainable solutions.

For researchers at Queen's, the strategic priorities and expertise are clear. We will continue to focus our efforts on established and emerging areas such as intelligent manufacturing and service delivery, advanced and sustainable materials, solutions to future transport requirements, and understanding and harnessing high energy and ultra-fast processes. We also understand that successful and sustainable economies are about people as well as products – as central parts of society they must be underpinned by equality, equal access to opportunity, and social justice at all levels.



Towards Zero-emission Public Buses

The UK Government's "Road to Zero" strategy laid out an ambitious plan for all new cars and vans to be effectively zero emission by 2040, as well as schemes to encourage low emission public transport.

Our researchers, in collaboration with Northern Ireland bus building company Wrightbus, have developed best-in-class low and zero emissions technologies, playing a key role in decarbonizing UK and international public transport.

Building on over 20 years of work, our researchers have developed advanced hybrid powertrain modelling technology which is integral to thousands of low emission hybrid vehicles currently in service around the world.

Researchers

Researchers at Queen's are on a mission to make the changing global digital space both safer and faster. Our world-leading teams in cyberspace resilience and networks and connectivity are breaking new ground in the digital world, just as our teams in Geographical Information Science are doing in the physical.

Novel computer systems and changing computing paradigms require agile and cutting-edge research that can be translated quickly and effectively into real world practice. The use of data-fusing enabling technologies will drive socio-economic development and improve the health, safety and security of future populations.

We work across disciplines to pursue digital breakthroughs that can act as a catalyst for new and creative cultural practices.

Secure Connected Intelligence

Our researchers design wireless communication systems that can withstand natural disasters and save lives.

Natural disasters kill an average of 60,000 people per year. Our researchers have designed and implemented a resilient and agile wireless communications system in Vietnam that provides seamless connectivity to relief authorities and workers when telecommunications infrastructures are significantly impaired.

The Integrated Heterogeneous Wireless System (IHWS) overcomes communication failures resulting from telecommunications networks damaged by natural disasters.

The solution offers a resilient and agile wireless communications design that can provide seamless connectivity even under critical conditions, such as destroyed telecommunication or electricity infrastructure.

The system also provides early warning of natural disasters by detecting water level, vibration and wind. In cities, the IWHS can detect increases in dust, temperature, noise, and carbon dioxide levels.

Edge Computing Hub: Making Edge Computing a Reality

The Edge Computing Hub is our growing and dynamic community of academic researchers and industry specialists working together to make 'edge computing' a reality.

Edge computing is a disruptive computing paradigm that allows processing data closer to users where it is generated, thus making internet applications more responsive, reliable and secure.

Our research tackles key system-centric challenges for deploying massively distributed edge systems by embedding intelligence into crucial decision-making activities. Current research addresses the challenges in distributed machine learning on edge computing systems and offloading services across a heterogeneous environment, as well as the standardisation of edge computing as an enabler for autonomous networking.

Our lived experience of conflict as a society, its causes and consequences, drives our determination to deliver research excellence. Our research impacts the lives and livelihoods of communities across the world. We examine the different factors involved in building inclusive and cohesive societies. These include the role of governance, accountability, international relations, understanding the child's perspective, the need for creativity and cultural understanding, and valuing heritage.

Our local experiences have become global insights – we will continue to work with colleagues and partners around the world to address the issues of fundamental rights, equality and social justice which lie at the heart of our mission.

Sharing Contested Heritage through Digital and Spatial Humanities

We partner with communities and institutions nationally and internationally to co-produce research that shares untold experiences of war. We enhance inclusive cross-community understanding of contested heritage. The Living Legacies 1914-18 WWI Engagement Centre has successfully created rich and extensive accounts of our shared heritage.

Our work gives new grounding and provides new spaces for engagement around contested heritage through co-production projects, workshops, and events, working alongside communities to uncover new knowledge and deepen understanding of our shared past.

The six-year programme has achieved wide recognition by NI and UK policymakers as meaningful and significant for enhancing cross-community relations.

The Lundy Model: Meaningful Participation of Children and Young People

The Lundy Model of child participation, based on four key concepts (Space, Voice, Audience, and Influence), has been used and adopted by national and international organisations, agencies, and governments to inform their understanding of children's participation. The Lundy Model has generated a sea-change in global understanding of child rights-based participation for both policy and practice.

The Lundy Model was developed by Queen's University Professor Laura Lundy. It transforms the ways in which

the views and experiences of children across the world are heard by the United Nations (UN), European Commission and by public bodies across the world. It ensures that the UN, governments, national and international organisations involve children meaningfully in decisions that affect their lives.



Brexit and Northern Ireland: Explaining and Monitoring Unique Arrangements

The UK's withdrawal from the EU has been an extraordinarily complicated social, political and economic process. Nowhere is such complexity more evident than in Northern Ireland. Managing the fallout of Brexit on the region preoccupied the UK-EU negotiations and bedevilled their post-Brexit relationship.

UK and EU policymakers and negotiators relied on the work of researchers at Queen's to deepen their understanding of the challenges and inform their approach to addressing them. Subsequently, business and civil society actors have drawn on information and explanations provided by Queen's researchers to adapt and respond to the new circumstances.

Environment

Understanding the relationship between humans and our environment has never been more important. The choices we face have never been so stark. Our climate is changing. The effects of this are being felt now as a day-to-day reality. There is an obligation on those involved in academic research to turn towards the challenges presented.

Whether this relates to our natural environment, creating safe and secure agri-food systems, assessing the way in which our built environment interacts with the natural world, or in the way we build and maintain truly liveable communities and societies, Queen's researchers are at the forefront of innovative, future-focused solutions that aim to make our footprint lighter, both on earth and beyond.

The Food Fortress: From Crisis to an Innovative Food Quality Assurance Scheme

The 2008 Dioxin crisis, in which Irish pork was contaminated through feed, resulted in approximately 30,000 tonnes of pig meat product being recalled and destroyed. Over 170,000 pigs and 5,700 cattle from farms that received contaminated product were culled.

Queen's led an intensive 'Food Fortress' research programme to develop, validate and implement innovative techniques to detect and monitor a broad spectrum of feed-related contaminants. This programme provided a supply chain-wide quality assurance scheme.

The Food Fortress scheme is recognised internationally as a world-leading risk management and feed quality assurance scheme and is used as a major marketing tool by the UK and Republic Ireland food industries.

RUN, JOG OR WALK

Northern Ireland's parks and scenery is the perfect backdrop for a walk, jog, or run. Queen's holds a weekly ParkRun at the Outdoor Sporting Facility, which is a great opportunity to meet other recreational runners.

PEDAL POWER

There are 140 km of bike trails across Northern Ireland. Rostrevor Mountain Bike Trails on Carlingford Lough has some of the most exhilarating mountain biking in the region, with stunning coastal views.

A HIKER'S PARADISE

Cave Hill Country Park is just six miles from Queen's and offers panoramic views of Belfast, while the Mourne Mountains in County Down has spectacular walks and hikes such as Slieve Donard, Northern Ireland's highest peak.

COASTLINE AND BEACHES

There are plenty of stunning beaches to enjoy a weekend walk. For example, Helen's Bay beach is just 25 minutes by train from Belfast. The Causeway Coastal Route is also well worth the road trip for its raw beauty and points of interest such as Mussenden Temple and the death-defying Carrick-a-Rede rope bridge.

WATERSPORTS

Northern Ireland has some of the best surfing in the world, and Portrush is the place to go if you want to catch waves. Strangford Lough is a kayaking haven, while the waterways and lakes of the Fermanagh Lakelands are ideal for stand-up paddle-boarding, windsurfing, and water-skiing.

CLIMBING

Climbers can enjoy Queen's PEC climbing wall or Boulderworld, Northern Ireland's premier bouldering facility. There are two main outdoor climbing areas; Fair Head is Northern Ireland's tallest cliff face, while the Mourne Mountains offers all types of climbing including wet bouldering with Cloughmor Extreme Adventure Centre.

ADRENALINE RUSH

If climbing doesn't satisfy your adrenaline fix, Ireland's longest zipline in Ballygawley is a staggering 500m long (toddsleap.com). For a day of thrilling activities like zorbing, raft building, and coasteering, visit Jungle NI in the Sperrin Mountains (thejungleni.com).

FORAGING AND BUSHCRAFT

The countryside around Belfast and beyond is a forager's paradise. From Cave Hill to Dundrum Coastal path, the hedgerows and hills are full of nature's food.

YOGA AND WELLBEING

Mindfulness and yoga can be found all over Northern Ireland, from hot yoga to weekend retreats. Namaste Yoga Centre, Maitri Studio, and Reform Studios are all close to Queen's Quarter and offer classes in different types of yoga, pilates, meditation, and sound bathing.

GETTING HERE

Belfast, as the capital of Northern Ireland, is connected to the rest of the UK, Ireland and Europe by sea, road and air.

BY BOAT

Fast ferry services including Stena Line and P&O Ferries make multiple daily crossings from Northern Ireland to ports in Scotland and England, Larne to Cairnryan, Belfast to Cairnryan, Belfast to Liverpool. An alternative route runs from Holyhead to Dublin, with excellent motorway connections between there and Belfast.

BY ROAD

Queen's is located in south central Belfast and as such is close to both Northern Ireland's main motorways, connecting it easily with the rest of Ireland.

BY BUS AND TRAIN

Queen's is a five-minute walk from Botanic Train Station on the Bangor, Larne, Newry, and Derry-Londonderry lines. Belfast's new Grand Central Station is the main transport hub for Northern Ireland and is the largest of its kind on the island of Ireland. Use it as a launchpad to explore further afield, an excellent choice when used in conjunction with the various student travel discount schemes available. A newly launched hourly Enterprise train service to Dublin makes it easier than ever to travel to and from Ireland's capital.

BY PLANE

Belfast is served by two airports: George Best Belfast City Airport and Belfast International Airport, which are both linked to the city by regular bus services. Dublin International Airport is located approximately 100 miles to the south.

Belfast's new Grand Central Station not only brings Northern Ireland to your doorstep but the rest of Ireland – and beyond. As a central travel hub in the heart of Belfast, Northern Ireland's railways is your portal to places and adventures both scenic and cultural. Take the world-renowned Derry~Londonderry Line often cited as one of the world's most scenic railway journeys, it's the westernmost railway line in the United Kingdom. Go further afield from Derry~Londonderry, to County Donegal and the wild Atlantic coast awaits. 1600 miles (2600 km) in length, it's one of the longest defined coastal routes in the world. It winds its way all along the Irish west coast from the


Inishowen Peninsula in the north down to the picturesque town of Kinsale, County Cork, in the south.

The upgraded Enterprise train service to Dublin now runs more frequently, so from Rugby at the Aviva Stadium to museums pubs and clubs, you can be in Ireland's cultural capital in two hours.

Dublin airport is an international hub for travel with flights to over 190 international destinations. Train connections from Dublin's Connolly Station, on the North side of the River Liffey, provides InterCity, Enterprise and commuter services to the north, north-west, south-east and south-west – putting the whole of Ireland – and the world in your grasp.

You need to register online and complete an application form as soon as applications are available from early Spring.

Information on how to apply will be sent automatically to all offer holders, and you are advised to apply for accommodation as soon as possible.

PRIVATE RENTED ACCOMMODATION

Private rent in Belfast is lower than in other UK cities and there is plenty of accommodation in the Queen's Quarter, within a 10-minute walk of the campus.

The website, nistudentpad.com/Accommodation is recommended by the Students' Union to help students search for private rental accommodation.

To assess the location of private sector accommodation in relation to the University, you can enter the University postcode (BT7 1NN) into an online map search.

Students from outside Northern Ireland often find it difficult providing a qualifying UK guarantor, a hurdle when renting in the private sector. Housing Hand has partnered with Queen's University Belfast to alleviate this issue for students.





WHEN TO APPLY

Applicants are advised to apply as early as possible for courses that start in late September. In the event that any programme receives a high number of applications, the university reserves the right to close the application portal.

If this is the case, you will find a notification on the programme application page in the direct application portal. We recommend that you apply early as we may need to arrange for interviews or aptitude tests. If you are an international student, you should allow extra time to get a student entry visa.

There is no standard closing date for postgraduate research programmes. But you should check the deadline dates for postgraduate funding applications (and eligibility requirements) through the website of the relevant school or institute. This will affect when you should submit your application.

ACCEPTABILITY OF QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION

For admission, an Honours degree from a UK or Republic of Ireland Higher Education Provider, or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the University is normally required. Professional qualifications and/or experience may be considered in combination with academic qualifications for entry to some programmes.

We only accept qualifications awarded by recognised accredited Higher Education Providers. ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

If your first language is not English, evidence of an acceptable level of proficiency will be required. In addition, applicants who are non-UK/Irish nationals must satisfy the UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) immigration requirements for English language for visa purposes. This evidence should be in the form of a Secure English Language Test (SELT), normally the IELTS for UKVI Academic test, or another English language qualification acceptable to the University which examines all four elements of language learning – Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking.

Within this Prospectus, the English language requirement for entry to each postgraduate taught and research programme is expressed in terms of IELTS Academic test scores. The IELTS Academic scores listed are the minimum overall score requirements. For each individual test component, the minimum score required is normally 5.5, however for some programmes the component scores necessary may be higher. The primary selection criteria are those related to the qualifications, skills, abilities and personal qualities of an applicant. The university will investigate the criminal record of a new applicant only if the primary selection criteria for a course have been met and if it is a requirement of the programme that this information is sought. Queen's acknowledges the key role of education in the rehabilitative process and a criminal record will not debar an applicant unless the nature and seriousness of the offence in question is incompatible with:

- the course applied for
- the ultimate professional or vocational goal
- participation in an academic and social setting and the university's responsibility to ensure a safe and neutral environment

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, ENVIRONMENT AND RURAL AFFAIRS (DAERA) POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH STUDENTSHIPS

DAERA (formerly DARD) normally funds research courses relevant to the agricultural, horticultural, forestry, fishing or food processing industries. Applications should be made directly to DAERA.

To be eligible for a full DAERA postgraduate studentship award, you must have been resident in Northern Ireland for the full three-year period before the first day of the first academic year of the course. Republic of Ireland (RoI) nationals meeting the three year NI residency are eligible for a full award under the Common Travel Area arrangement. EU, EEA or Swiss nationals meeting the three year residency must have settled or presettled status in the UK under the EU Settlement Scheme.

Non-EU nationals meeting the three year residence must be settled in the UK by the closing date of the application. The main purpose of residence in NI must not have been to receive full-time education during any part of that three year period. 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POSTGRADUATE TAUGHT

TAUGHT MASTERS DEGREES

Master's degrees are designed to enable students to focus on a particular subject area or field of study in greater depth than they have encountered before in undergraduate study or employment experience. Students on our taught Master's programmes usually undertake a combination of taught modules, assessment and supervised independent research. Master's programmes usually involve two semesters of classes and assessed work followed by four or five months of research culminating in a dissertation or project.

Students undertaking a Master's degree have the opportunity to undergo a programme of training and development which aims to develop their leadership skills. Through the programme, students are able to undertake a 360-degree assessment of their skills and to participate in a range of training sessions and developmental activities, relevant to their needs.

For admission to a degree, a Second Class Honours degree from a UK or Republic of Ireland Higher Education Provider or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the University is normally required. Entrance requirements vary by programme and you should consult the individual programme entries in this guide or the online Course Finder qub.ac.uk/courses

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES

Postgraduate Diploma courses usually last for nine months, with Postgraduate Certificate courses normally lasting four months. Where offered as a standalone qualification, they are typically structured in the same way as Master's degrees, without the research dissertation or project, and usually cover some of the same modules as the related Master's degree. The Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) is a vocational course which lasts for nine months and includes teaching placements.

The University offers postgraduate study for diplomas and certificates in a wide range of subjects. It may be possible for you to transfer registration from a Postgraduate Diploma to a Master's degree after completion of assessment at the required standard. All postgraduate taught students have the opportunity to undertake training in academic skills such as dissertation writing and referencing.

CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD)

Some postgraduate taught programmes can be used for Continuing Professional Development (CPD). In addition, the University provides some non-credit-bearing CPD courses, for example, through the William J Clinton Leadership Institute in Queen's Business School.



If you have your own research idea, contact the relevant school to discuss it with us. If you are unsure of who to contact, email our faculty hubs* for guidance. You might be asked to provide a short outline of your proposal to help us identify potential supervisors.



CHECK THE REQUIREMENTS

Check that you meet, or have the potential to meet the academic and, if applicable, English language entry requirements for your programme.

Also bear in mind that if you are applying for funding, there might be an application deadline. So find out if your programme has a closing date for applications too.

POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH

As part of the Russell Group, Queen's is proud to be one of the UK's leading research universities, offering postgraduate research opportunities across all fields of study.

A research degree offers you the opportunity to gain in-depth, specialised knowledge in an original research project, guided by a supervisory team, which culminates in the presentation of a thesis which you defend in an oral examination.

During your studies you will also develop research, personal and professional development skills that will support future careers within academia, industry or the public sector.

PHD/MPHIL/MD/MCH

You will produce a traditional thesis, or, in the case of creative practice projects, your original creative works and an integrated critical analysis. For admission, an Upper Second Class Honours degree from a UK or Republic of Ireland Higher Education Provider or equivalent qualification acceptable to the university is normally required. Specific entrance criteria by programme are detailed in the online Course Finder qub.ac.uk/courses

You will be expected to submit your thesis at the end of three years of full-time registration for PhD, two years for MPhil/MD and one year for MCh (or part-time equivalent).

PHD BY PUBLISHED WORKS

This is awarded for the successful submission of a portfolio of research that was published prior to you registering on the programme, along with a critical analysis.

You must be an academic member of staff at Queen's, and have been so for a minimum of one year.

Registration is normally on a part-time basis, under the direction of an adviser appointed by the university. You will be expected to submit your published works, with a 10,000-word critical analysis, within one year.

PROFESSIONAL DOCTORATES

These are specialist qualifications available in the area of psychology which combine taught postgraduate modules with independent research projects located within a profession or practice placement.

HIGHER DOCTORATES

These are awarded to individuals who have an authoritative standing in their field of study, and seminal publications which have led to extensions or the development of knowledge by others.

In order to apply for this programme, you must have a significant link to the university, normally by being a graduate or a current academic member of staff. You will usually have a minimum of 10 years' research experience at a postdoctoral level.

WORKING AWAY FROM THE UNIVERSITY

You may be permitted to carry out some of your research away from Queen's. You will need to prove to the university that you will maintain appropriate contact with your supervisor and you will have access to the appropriate facilities during your time spent away. You may be required to spend a specified period of time in residence at the university.

You will be subject to the university's normal training and monitoring requirements.

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
