HOW TO APPLY

Applying to university doesn't have to be complicated — visit uab.ca/apply for answers to frequently asked questions and videos to guide you through the application process.

1 CHOOSE YOUR CAMPUS uab.ca/campus

- North Campus (main campus), Augustana Campus (Camrose, Alberta) or Campus Saint-Jean (French campus)

2 CHOOSE YOUR PROGRAM(S) uab.ca/programs

3 SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION EARLY

- October 1** of your grade 12 year applications open.
- As part of the application process, you will report your Grade 11 results and Grade 12 Course Registrations or first semester results.

APPLY FOR RESIDENCE

- April 30** is the deadline to guarantee a spot in first-year student housing.
- Apply for housing on your admission application or at uab.ca/residence

AFTER YOU APPLY

After you apply for admission you will receive a unique student number and a Campus Computing ID (CCID) which can be used to apply for scholarships and awards.

4 APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS EARLY uab.ca/awards

5 UNDERSTAND EVALUATION

- Admission to the U of A is competitive and on-going, meaning some students can receive an admission offer as early as October.
- Admission averages are calculated using the five required courses for your program(s) of choice, informed by the courses and final marks included on your application.

Where final grade 12 marks are unavailable, the final mark in the equivalent grade 11 course and grade 12 course registrations will be used.

Some programs may have additional requirements for admission, such as the Casper assessment.

6 CHECK YOUR STATUS

- After applying, you will have access to Launchpad. Here you can check your application status, submit outstanding documents, update new final marks and review any checklist items for your program.
- We will also assign you a U of A email address to check for notifications or correspondence. Learn more uab.ca/aftapp

If you haven't been offered admission, that's okay! You will have the opportunity to submit new final marks for reevaluation.

7 ACCEPT YOUR OFFER AND APPLY FOR YOUR STUDY PERMIT

- Once you receive an admission offer, you must accept it and pay the tuition deposit by the deadline stated in Launchpad.
- Don't forget to accept your residence offer as well! Learn more uab.ca/accept
- You should apply for your study permit for post-secondary studies as soon as you receive your admission offer. Learn more uab.ca/permit

8 REGISTER FOR COURSES

ATTEND A REGISTRATION 101 WORKSHOP

BUILD A DRAFT SCHEDULE

- Before course registration opens, you can prepare by building a draft schedule.
- You will receive access to build your timetable after accepting your offer.

GET REGISTERED

- Course registration will open in **early April**.
- Be among the first to select your classes by accepting your admission offer.

TAKE NOTE

International Students:

You must obtain a new study permit for post-secondary studies, even if you already have a high school study permit.

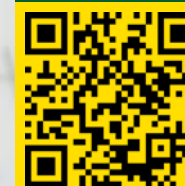

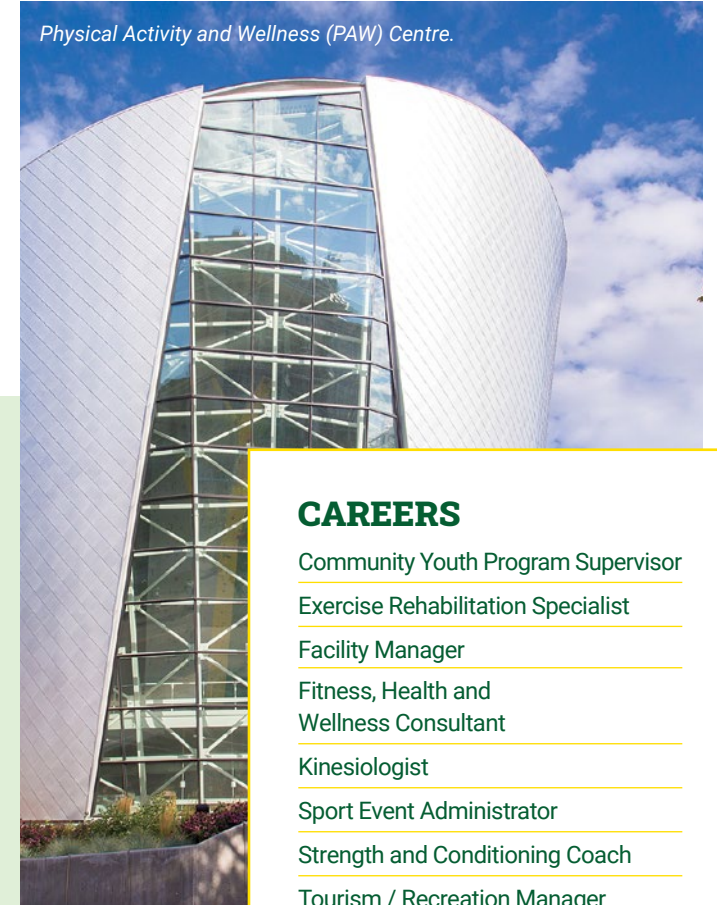

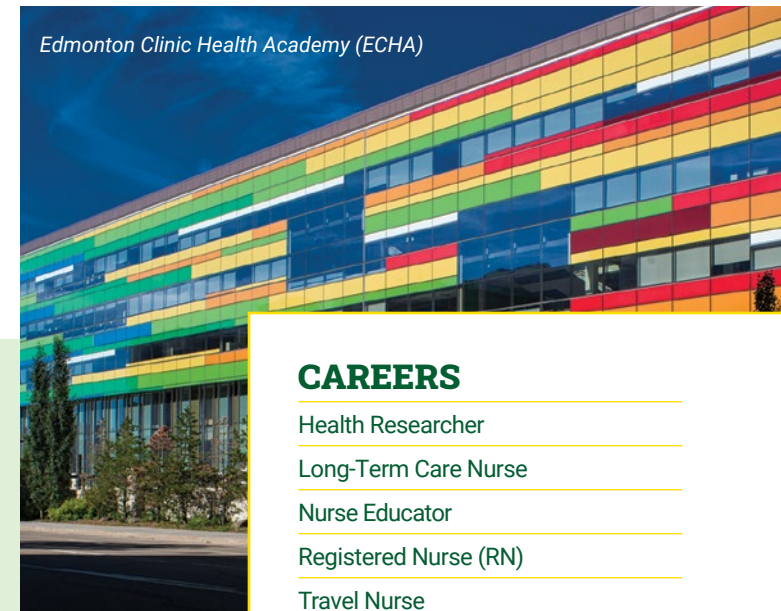

SCHOOLS NOT ACCREDITED BY A RECOGNIZED US REGIONAL ACCREDITOR	For schools that are not accredited by a recognized US regional accreditor, students need to present all the required subjects through standardized tests (e.g. AP).
