## 5 UNDERSTAND EVALUATION

- Admission to the U of A is competitive and on-going, meaning some students can receive an admission offer as early as October.
- Admission averages are calculated using the five required courses for your program(s) of choice, informed by the courses and final marks included on your application.

*Where final grade 12 marks are unavailable, the final mark in the equivalent grade 11 course and grade 12 course registrations will be used.*

*Some programs may have additional requirements for admission, such as the Casper assessment.*

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## CHECK YOUR STATUS

- After applying, you will have access to Launchpad. Here you can check your application status, submit outstanding documents, update new final marks and review any checklist items for your program.
- We will also assign you a U of A email address to check for notifications or correspondence.
