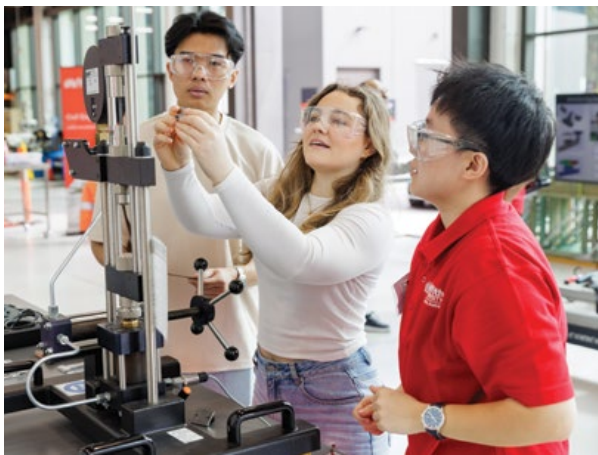

Services for First Peoples students

With one of the largest Indigenous university student populations in Queensland, Griffith is committed to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander student success. The GUMURRII Student Success Unit (SSU) is Griffith University's dedicated services unit for all First Peoples students. GUMURRII staff are based at each of our campuses to foster a safe and culturally appropriate learning environment for undergraduate and postgraduate students throughout their university journey.

We recognise a range of pathways to help you get into your preferred degree, including vocational education and training (VET), undergraduate diplomas, scholarships and more.

Guaranteed Admission

We offer a range of guaranteed admission schemes including the Year 12 Early Offer Guarantee, ATAR/Rank Guarantee, Griffith University Head Start Guarantee and the VET Guarantee for those who have completed an AQF Certificate III or above.

Depending on your study choices, you may be eligible for guaranteed admission into one of our undergraduate degrees.

Year 12 Early Offer Guarantee

To give you certainty about your future, we've developed a way for you to get an offer to study at Griffith before you receive your ATAR or IB diploma results.

We'll also make early offers to students who have completed a VET qualification prior to starting uni or have successfully completed a Griffith Head Start program. Under this scheme, offers will be issued from September through November—so you can relax and enjoy your break before you start your next chapter at university.

To be considered, simply list one of the eligible degrees on your QTAC application; you'll be considered in one of our early offer rounds in September, October and November. Some degrees may require additional documentation.

ATAR/Rank Guarantee

We encourage high school students to achieve an ATAR. At Griffith, you'll be recognised for your performance in your studies with an assurance you'll be able to take your place in a range of our in-demand undergraduate degrees.

Under this scheme, we'll offer you a place in the degree of your choice provided you achieve its guaranteed ATAR/admission rank. This guarantee applies to the QTAC and UAC rounds up to mid-January each year, or until your chosen degree is closed for further intake.

Griffith University Head Start program

Designed for high-achieving Year 11 and 12 students looking to hit the ground running when they get to uni, Head Start will cover your tuition fees for your chosen single course (subject), so you can save money, gain credit and be guaranteed admission into a wide range of Griffith degrees.

With over 35 courses available on campus, at school or online, Head Start is an ideal chance to learn from industry leaders and stretch your academic boundaries. Eligible students can start the program in Semester 2 of Year 11 and complete up to two courses while at school.

When you finish Head Start and Year 12, you'll be eligible for an offer into more than 80 single and double degrees and receive two (2.00) adjustments towards your ATAR for all eligible Griffith undergraduate degrees.

VET Guarantee

Griffith's VET Guarantee is an assurance that your AQF Certificate III, IV or Diploma provides admission to a range of degrees. If you've completed one of these qualifications, you don't need to apply separately for this guarantee—just let us know in your QTAC or UAC application.

TAFE qualifications

If you're in Year 12 and have completed a TAFE qualification while at school, you'll need to apply via QTAC or UAC.

Mature applicants with a TAFE Diploma, Advanced Diploma or Certificate IV in Adult Tertiary Preparation (CATP) may be eligible to apply directly through our TAFE Admission Pathway. We also offer dual TAFE diploma/Griffith degree qualifications with TAFE Queensland, allowing you to apply directly to start at Griffith once you complete your diploma.

For eligible degrees and to apply for the TAFE Admission Pathway or CATP direct admission, see griffith.edu.au/vet

If you already have a diploma or degree, you will be guaranteed at least 40 credit points (CP)—or six months of full-time study—towards your eligible degree. For more information, visit griffith.edu.au/credit

International Baccalaureate students

We welcome applications from International Baccalaureate (IB) students. If you've completed your IB diploma, your results will be converted to a tertiary admission rank by your local tertiary admissions centre (QTAC or UAC).

If you meet the threshold, you may receive a guaranteed offer into select degrees under our Guaranteed Admission Scheme. Best of all, you won't need to fill out a separate application and any eligible adjustments will be applied automatically.

Undergraduate diplomas

If you feel ready for uni but know you may not meet the required rank for entry into a degree, our undergraduate diplomas can offer you a supported start to uni and help build the foundational knowledge and skills you need for bachelor-level study. You'll complete your first year in the diploma alongside students in the corresponding bachelor degree, finishing in the same time and at no extra cost, with access to a range of student support programs.

This fee-free, uni-ready program will help you experience university life while building your confidence and academic study skills. You'll be all set for success as you learn the essentials of critical reading, writing and referencing in our distinctively supportive environment.

You can study EmpowerED in the way that suits you best: our standard trimester option, offered full time or part time at Gold Coast, Logan or online, with two intakes each year and six-week course blocks supported by regular timetabled workshops.



Or, if you need maximum flexibility, you can choose to complete EmpowerED online and on demand through Griffith GO (see page 9), which lets you work

through your courses at your own pace on a non-standard calendar, so you can fit study into your life.

However you get EmpowerED, on completing the program, you'll be granted guaranteed admission to your preferred Griffith degree in the next trimester (subject to admission requirements) as well as gaining credit towards your degree.

Year 12 Subject Adjustment

If you are currently in Year 12 and have successfully studied a subject in high school that requires a high level of skill or knowledge, you may be able to receive an adjustment to your ATAR or rank from secondary studies of up to six (6.00) ranks (or 2.00 ranks a subject) under this pathway.

Location adjustments

If you live in one of our eligible suburbs from the Greater Brisbane region to Nambucca Shire, NSW, and have never studied at university before, you may be eligible for one of our location adjustments.

If you are new to tertiary study and reside in:

- Brisbane, Logan, Ipswich or the Redlands—You may be eligible for two (2.00) adjustments for degrees at Brisbane (City and South)
- the Gold Coast or Logan—You may be eligible for two (2.00) adjustments when you apply for degrees at Gold Coast, Logan or online
- a rural or remote area—You may be eligible for two (2.00) adjustments for degrees at Brisbane, Gold Coast, Logan or online.

Educational Access Scheme

If you've experienced difficult circumstances that have negatively impacted your studies, the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) can help you get into your preferred degree. If you are eligible for the EAS, you may receive adjustments that improve your chances of getting an offer.

Elite Athlete Adjustment Factors

Our Elite Athlete Adjustment Factors acknowledge the value of integrating sporting and academic aspirations. As a recognised Elite Athlete Friendly university, we may consider the impact of your sporting commitments on your last two years of education and you may receive adjustments to eligible QTAC preferences.

Bachelor of Medical Science adjustments

For applicants to our highly competitive Bachelor of Medical Science, a range of incremental adjustments are available based on EAS, location and rurality.

Bridging courses and enabling programs

If you don't have the assumed knowledge or prerequisites expected for your desired degree, you may like to explore our range of bridging courses and enabling programs in order to strengthen your foundation for study.

Bridging courses can help you fill gaps in your existing knowledge and may also help you to meet subject prerequisites. Alternatively, enabling programs can help you obtain the qualifications required for admission into your preferred degree.

Our Credit Guarantee

If you already have a diploma or degree, you will be guaranteed at least 40 credit points (CP), or six months of full-time study, towards your eligible Griffith degree. If you've completed a Certificate III or IV, you may be able to access up to 20 CP.

In either case, the study must have been completed in the 10 years prior to your application.

To make things smooth for you, we'll apply your credit in recognition of your achievements. This credit will be applied in place of some of your degree's elective subjects. In certain circumstances, your non-formal (e.g., workplace, volunteer or community-based) and informal (e.g., social, family, hobby or leisure) learning may also be considered as part of an application for credit and recognition of prior education towards your degree.

How does it work?

When you study a double degree, you'll complete the two degrees at the same time, usually over four or five years. As a double degree graduate, you'll receive two degree certificates—one for each qualification.

Final-year capstone

In your final year of study, you'll complete a capstone course that will bring together the knowledge and skills you've gained in each component of your double degree.

Practical industry experience

Our double degrees include opportunities for industry internships and work placements, so you'll make practical connections within and between each of your areas of study.

Planning for a career in medicine

At Griffith, medicine is a graduate-entry, postgraduate degree. While we don't require you to choose a specific degree to apply, we do encourage you to study something you're genuinely interested in. It's also a good idea to choose a degree that can lead to a job on its own while you work towards getting into medicine. The following degrees provide good foundational knowledge for a future in medicine:

- Bachelor of Medical Science (high-school leavers only)
- Bachelor of Biomedical Science
- Bachelor of Health Science
- Bachelor of Medical Laboratory Science
- Bachelor of Pharmacy (Honours)
- Bachelor of Pharmacology and Toxicology
- Bachelor of Paramedicine

Entry into medicine is competitive. Depending on your degree, there are three criteria for the Doctor of Medicine that are used to rank candidates:

1. Completion of a bachelor degree, with a GPA of 5.0 or above on a 7-point scale calculated using the Graduate Entry Medical School Admissions System (GEMSAS) schema.*
2. Achieving a minimum score of 50 in each section of the Graduate Medical School Admission Test (GAMSAT), and a minimum overall score of 50.†
3. Performance in the Griffith University Multi Station Admissions Assessment (GUMSAA).†

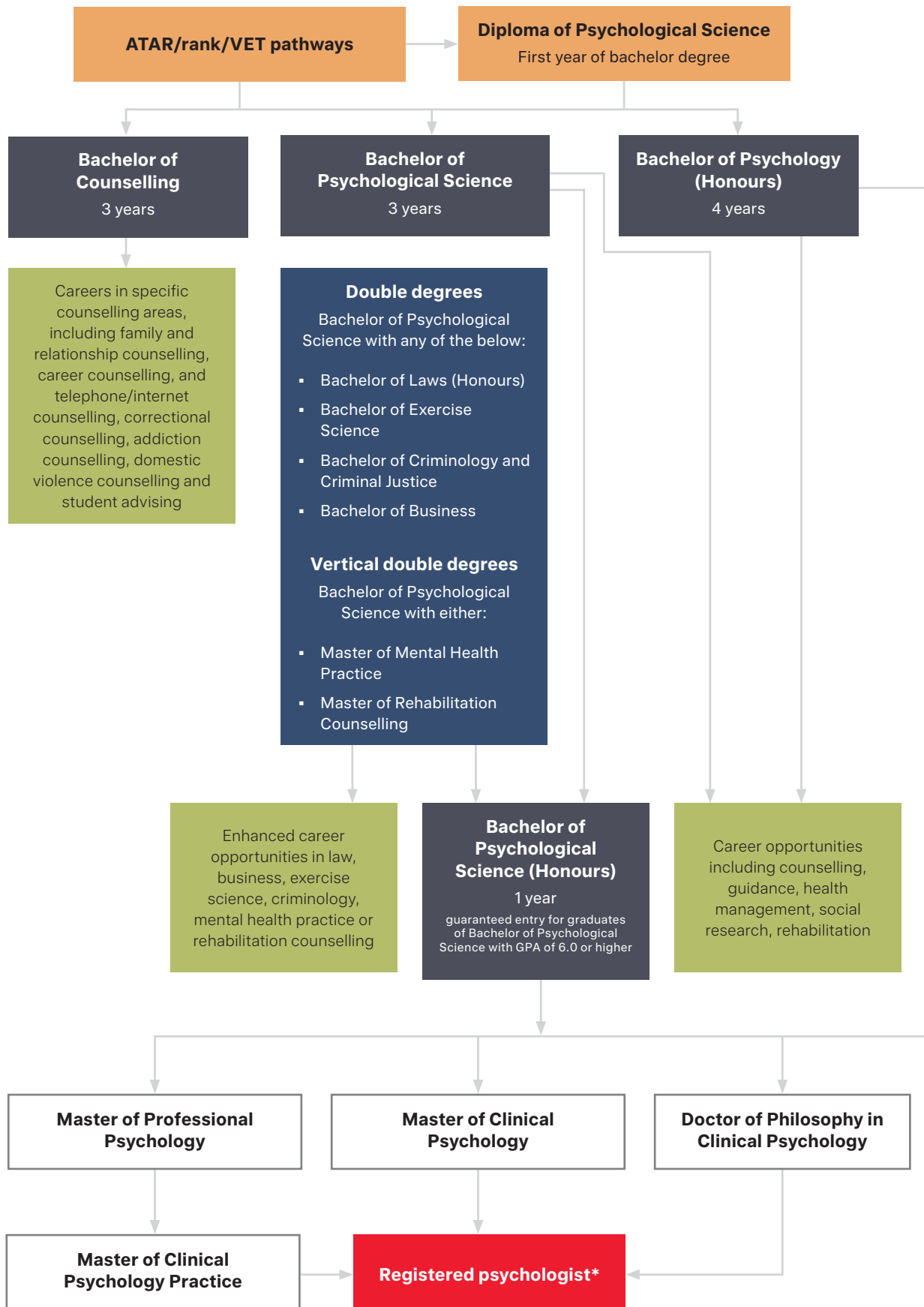

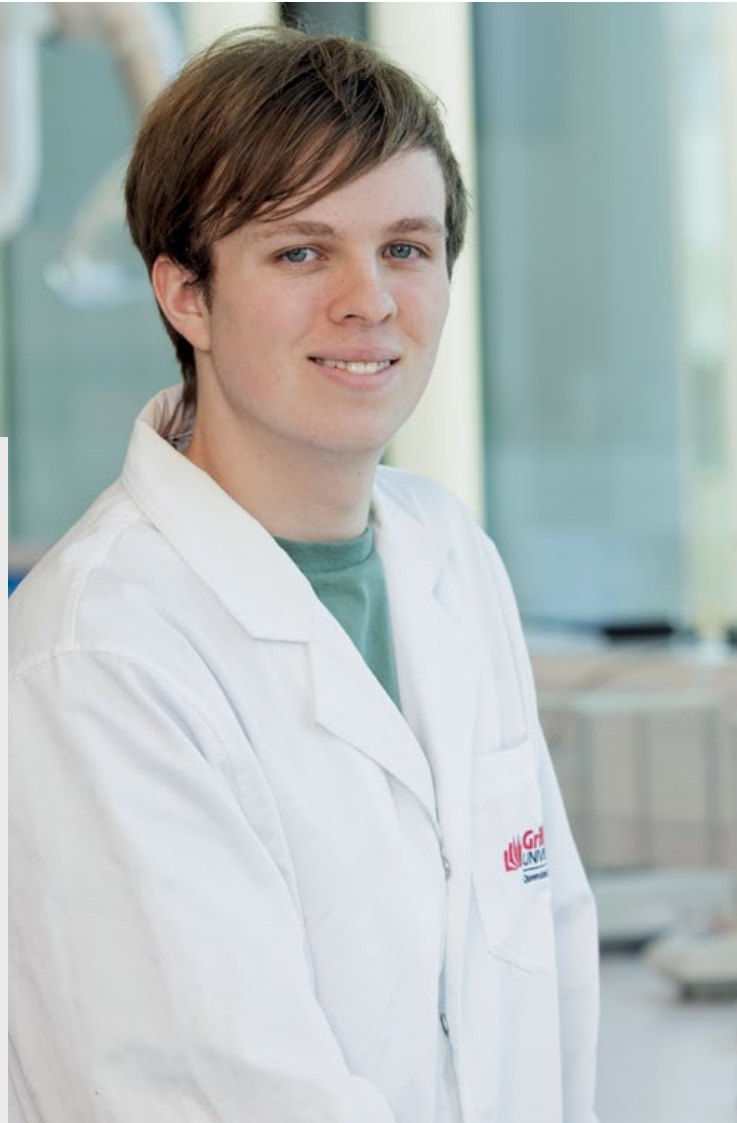

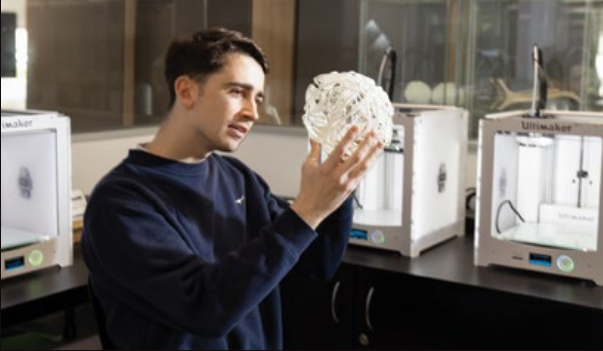

If you are a...

High school student

You can gain admission into most Griffith University bachelor degrees by:

- meeting the program's minimum ATAR/rank
- improving your selection rank through a Griffith undergraduate diploma
- undertaking a bridging or enabling program to meet the degree's minimum rank and/or prerequisites
- satisfying additional requirements such as a portfolio, audition, admission test and/or interview.

If you do not gain admission to your preferred degree, consider another Griffith degree that may assist with upgrading your selection rank.

Once you're a Griffith student, you'll be able to apply for an internal transfer into most of our degrees. You may also be considered based on successful completion of your bachelor study.

Mature or recent student

- meeting the program's prerequisites and minimum selection rank, based on your existing qualifications
- leveraging your work/life experience (e.g., employment history, volunteer experience or life skills) and completing the Griffith EmpowerED University Preparation Program
- improving your selection rank through an alternative Griffith undergraduate degree or diploma
- undertaking a bridging or enabling program to meet the degree's prerequisites
- satisfying additional requirements such as a portfolio, audition, admission test and/or interview.

Whenever you finished Year 12, your ATAR/OP is valid. If this is your highest rank, we will consider it first.

If you did not do as well as you hoped in Year 12, or did not complete secondary school, there are many other options that can assist with meeting admission requirements, including previous work experience.*

* Some exceptions apply.

High school, mature or recent student with TAFE or other VET qualifications[^]

You can gain admission into most Griffith University bachelor degrees by:

- meeting the program's prerequisites and minimum selection rank, based on your qualifications
- improving your selection rank through an alternative Griffith undergraduate degree or diploma
- undertaking a bridging course or enabling program to meet the degree's prerequisites
- satisfying additional requirements such as a portfolio, audition, admission test and/or interview.

Things to consider when choosing the correct pathway can depend on your prior knowledge, how comfortable you are in the study level, and for which degree you are applying. The above advice may not apply for competitive degrees. If you're undertaking other studies to upgrade, then it is important that you receive the right advice prior to commencing, to ensure that the study will meet your requirements.

Eligibility and admissions pathways

If you have not met the admission requirements through your high school studies, there are other admission pathways that can help you upgrade to your preferred degree, or to satisfy subject prerequisites. For more information, visit griffith.edu.au/pathways or see page 14 of this guide.

Subject prerequisites

Some Griffith degrees have subject prerequisites as conditions of admission. These are subjects in areas such as English, mathematics and science that you must have successfully completed in order to be considered for a place in a degree.

If you have not met your desired degree's prerequisite requirements, you may be able to complete a bridging course.

Merit

For most degrees, applicants who meet the minimum rank set for admission will receive an offer. For degrees with competitive or quota admission, minimum selection thresholds will be determined in the main round for that degree, based on available places and quality of the applicant pool.

For most Qld and interstate Year 12 students, your rank will be based on your Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). Post-school, your ATAR will become your rank. In addition to secondary qualifications, the University also considers ranks for both Year 12s and mature applicants' VET qualifications, tertiary study, bridging and preparatory programs, work experience and more.

Assumed knowledge

Most of our degrees assume you have studied certain subjects at school (or equivalent studies) and that you'll be able to build on this knowledge at university.

Almost every Griffith degree expects you to have a foundational understanding of English, expressed as assumed knowledge in **any General or Applied English subject**. This is achieved through completing a General English subject (including English, English as an Additional Language, Literature or English & Literature Extension) or the Applied English subject, Essential English, in Year 12 with a minimum grade of C in Units 3 and 4 or equivalent.

Recommended studies

Recommended studies are listed to encourage applicants to consider these foundational content areas. However, they are not as crucial as assumed knowledge.

Additional selection criteria

Some degrees, particularly those specialising in the creative and performing arts, require applicants to submit a video or portfolio and/or attend an audition or interview. You can find specific information about these requirements at griffith.edu.au/degrees

English language requirements

If you undertook previous study in a language other than English, or completed your study outside Australia, you may need to demonstrate your level of reading, writing and comprehension of English. The English language proficiency requirements vary between degrees and are listed on our degree finder at griffith.edu.au/degrees

Offer timing

QTAC and UAC offers

For most degrees, we'll commence making offers to mature applicants from August.

From September, Griffith will start making offers to Year 12 students based on criteria other than ATAR, such as Year 12 Early Offers.

In November, creative and performing arts offers commence being made based on auditions and portfolios.

Year 12s will be considered for offers based on ATARs in the major December round, when the majority of degrees are on offer, including some of our competitive health degrees.

All competitive health degrees will be on offer in the mid-January offer round.

Student accommodation

If you're thinking of living on campus, or off campus with one of our preferred providers, submit your application as soon as possible. Accommodation offers are based on distance from the University and time of application. Successful applicants will be notified after QTAC and UAC offers are made.

Fees

You can find indicative fees for specific degrees via our study website. Domestic students studying an undergraduate degree may be eligible for a Commonwealth supported place. This means you pay a student contribution for your degree, with most of the cost covered by the Australian Government, through the HECS-HELP scheme.

Application options

Deferment

Deferment allows you to delay the start of your studies while still securing your place. Deferment is not available for all degrees and cannot exceed 12 months. You can request to defer after you receive an offer by selecting the deferment option when you respond to your QTAC offer. For UAC, you can email deferred@griffith.edu.au to request deferment.

Refer to griffith.edu.au/degrees to check if you can defer your chosen program.

Internal transfer

As a continuing Griffith student, you will be eligible to apply for admission to most degrees via an internal transfer.

Information for mature and interstate students

If you completed high school under a system other than the ATAR, you can use the information below to help figure out your study and admission pathway options.

Make your qualification work for you

Griffith accepts applicants from a diversely qualified pool, including current and previous Year 12 students, mature age, those holding VET and post-secondary qualifications, and those transferring from complete and incomplete tertiary studies.

Eligible students who complete Year 12 in Queensland have been issued an ATAR since 2020. If you completed Year 12 in or before 2019 and qualified for an Overall Position (OP), you can apply to the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) to obtain your ATAR statement.

Regardless of which system under which you completed high school, all applicants must satisfy any relevant eligibility requirements, which are usually specified in terms such as subject prerequisites or English language proficiency. However, for most of our degrees, applicants need only meet the minimum selection threshold (or rank).

ATARs and selection ranks use the same scale. For example, an ATAR of 93.40 is equal to a selection rank of 93.40.

For some degrees, additional selection criteria such as portfolios or interviews can be used in addition to, or instead of, academic achievement in order to rank students for admission.

English subjects

In this guide, **General English** subjects include English, English as an Additional Language, Literature, and English & Literature Extension. **General or Applied English** includes all of the above as well as the QCAA Applied English subject, Essential English.

You must have achieved the equivalent of a minimum grade of C in Units 3 and 4 to meet English subject prerequisites or assumed knowledge expectations.
