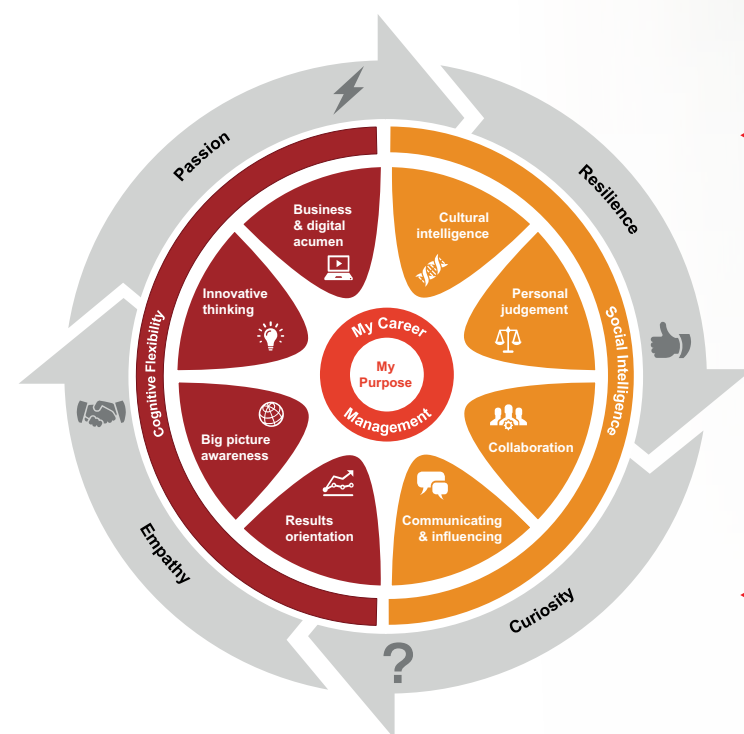

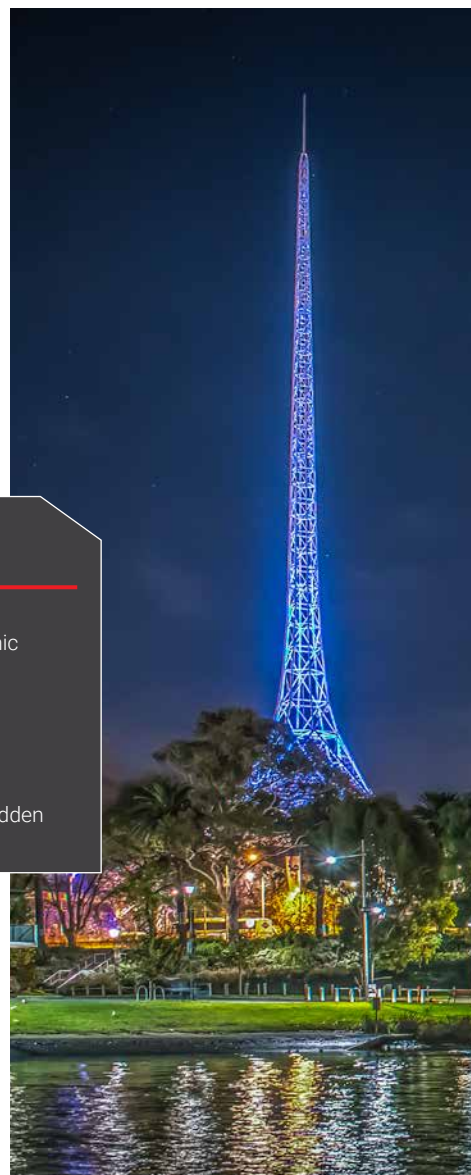

Safe and affordable with an unbeatable lifestyle, Melbourne is only a short drive from some of Australia's most beautiful natural locations.

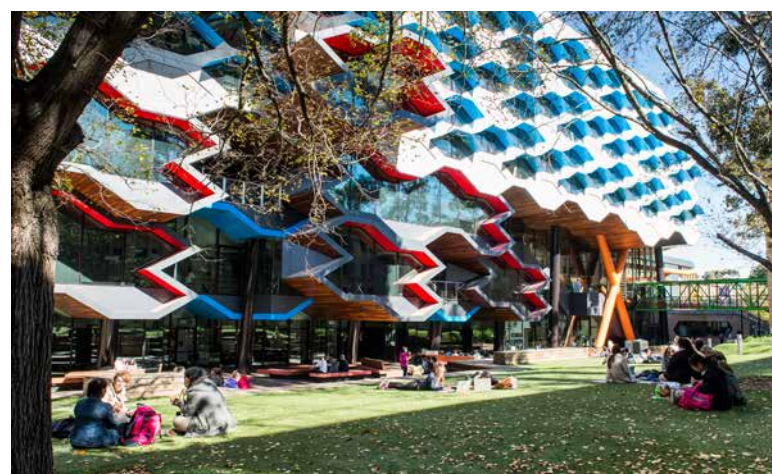

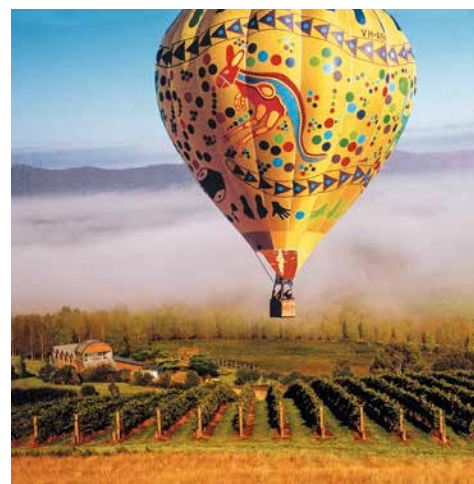

English and academic entry requirements



At La Trobe University, we want you to succeed in your studies. To be admitted to your preferred degree, you'll need to meet the necessary English language and academic requirements.

English language requirements

English is the primary language used in lectures, tutorials and seminars. Therefore, it's important you meet the necessary requirements.

We accept the following English language tests, except where specified:

- the IELTS (International English Language Testing System) Academic test
- the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)
- the Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE Academic)
- the Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE)
- the Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE).

Other evidence of English proficiency may be accepted in individual cases. Refer to our website for more information about English requirements.

Students without the required level of English need to satisfactorily complete an intensive program of English language before being admitted to La Trobe University. We can arrange an appropriate English language program at La Trobe College Australia, our preferred pathway provider. For more information, see pages 72 and 73.

Academic entry requirements

You'll also need to meet the academic entry requirements, which differ between degree programs.

Undergraduate

You must hold qualifications deemed equivalent to an Australian Year 12 Senior Secondary Certificate of Education if you want to apply for an undergraduate course at La Trobe University. These academic entry requirements are listed online.

Prerequisites

Some courses also require prior knowledge of a certain subject or subjects, which can be found in the full course listing. Please refer to the website for more information about your particular courses.

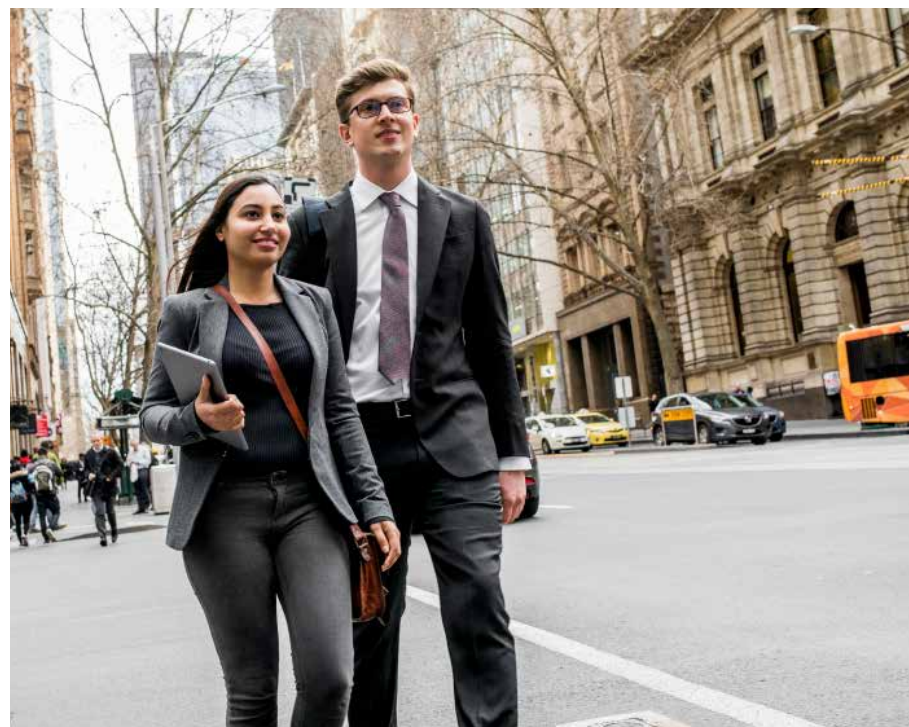

Student visa

Undergraduate and postgraduate scholarships

- **La Trobe College Excellence Scholarships** award high-achieving international students by granting 15 to 25 per cent off tuition fees.
- **Undergraduate and postgraduate regional campus scholarships** award international students studying at one of our regional campuses with up to A\$5 000 worth of tuition fees.

Research scholarships

- **La Trobe University Postgraduate Research Scholarships (LTUPRS)** award high-achieving students undertaking a research degree with a living allowance stipend for up to two years (Master's) or for up to three and a half years (Doctoral programs).
- **La Trobe University Full Fee Research Scholarships (LTUFFRS)** award high-achieving students undertaking a research degree by covering two years of tuition fees (Master's) or four years of tuition fees (PhD).

- **The David Myers Research Scholarship** awards the highest University-ranked graduate research scholarship applicants in each College, regardless of their discipline or nationality. Benefits include a significant contribution towards living costs, a research support grant, and research allowance.
- **Specialist research scholarships** are awarded to La Trobe students undertaking key research projects.

External scholarships

In addition to scholarships administered by La Trobe, there are many external scholarships you may be eligible to apply for:

- **The Australia Awards Scheme** are prestigious awards granted to high-achieving full-time students from the Asia-Pacific region. The scholarship covers full tuition fees, basic health insurance, a return airfare to Australia, and establishment and living allowances.
- **Endeavour Scholarships and Fellowships** offer support to international students to undertake study, research or professional development in Australia. Scholarships are available for a two-year Master's degree or four-year PhD and are capped at A\$15 000 per semester.

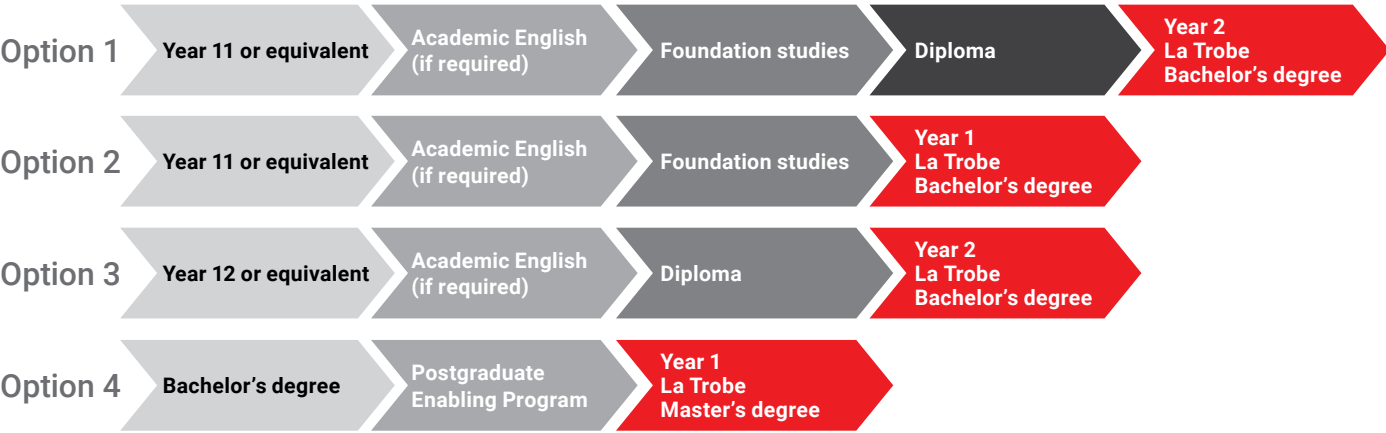

Entry requirements

La Trobe usually requires a C average for entry into the Study Abroad and Exchange program (GPA 2.5). Entry to individual subjects depends on prerequisites and class limitations.

If you're currently completing or have just completed your last year of secondary/high school, you'll be required to meet the minimum academic entry requirements for the undergraduate degree program that best matches your Study Abroad program.

You must also provide evidence of your English language proficiency.

Living costs



Making the decision to study overseas is exciting and life changing. Before you leave, it is important to consider the costs of living in Australia.

The below guide provides an average estimate of the costs associated with your studies, so that you can start planning.

Bringing your family

The Department of Home Affairs (DoHA) advises you allow at least A\$7 100 per year for your spouse and A\$3 040 per year for your first child. These amounts exclude tuition fees.

- evidence of your English language proficiency
- any other information specified in the entry requirements for your course
- any supplementary application forms that are required.

Note: if you want to apply for a credit transfer, you will be required to provide your course syllabus or course outlines.

Accept your offer

Once your application is approved, you'll receive an email with your offer letter and a step-by-step guide on how to accept your offer, pay your tuition fees and provide any outstanding documents.

06

Apply for your student visa

Once you have accepted your offer, you will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). This enables you to apply for an Australian student visa.
