Professorship (W2) (6 years/tenure track) of Comparative Literature and Literary Theory

commencing as soon as possible.

The applicant's work in the field of Comparative Literature must be indicative of philological expertise in at least two different languages and of an interest in Literary Theory.

International research, respectively teaching experience is desirable. A special interest in an East European or Non-European Literature would be welcome. In addition, we would welcome a methodological interest in Gender Studies.

LMU Munich seeks to appoint a highly qualified junior academic to this professorship and, therefore, especially encourages early-career scholars to apply. Prerequisites for this position are a university degree and a doctoral degree or a comparable specific qualification in one of the relevant philological areas. With an excellent record in research and teaching to date, prospective candidates will have demonstrated the potential for an outstanding academic career.

The initial appointment will be for six years. After a minimum of three years, it can be converted into a permanent position pending a positive evaluation of the candidate's performance in research and teaching as well as his or her personal aptitude, and if all legal conditions are met.

Under the terms of the „LMU Academic Career Program“, in exceptional cases and subject to outstanding performance in research and teaching, the position may be converted from a W2 into a W3 Full Professorship at a later date.

The Leverhulme Trust is currently accepting applications for the following awards

Research Fellowships enable experienced researchers to undertake a programme of research on a topic of their choice. Up to £55,000 is available for research costs, replacement teaching costs, or loss of earnings. Fellowships are offered for periods of 3 to 24 months. Approximately 100 fellowships are available.

International Academic Fellowships provide established UK researchers with an opportunity to spend time in one or more research centres outside the UK, to develop new knowledge and skills, for example by learning new techniques, collaborating with colleagues overseas, or developing innovations in teaching. Up to £45,000 is available to provide replacement teaching costs, research and travel costs. Fellowships are offered for periods of 3 to 12 months. Approximately 15 fellowships are available.

Emeritus Fellowships enable retired academics from UK institutions to complete a body of research for publication. Up to £22,000 is available for research costs. Fellowships are offered for periods of 3 to 24 months. Approximately 35 fellowships are available.

Closing date: 31 January 2019

Study Abroad Studentships support a period of advanced study or research anywhere in the world, except for the UK and USA. £21,000 a year is available for maintenance and travel; additional help with fees, research costs, and maintenance for dependents may also be provided. Studentships are offered for periods of 12 to 24 months. Approximately 20 studentships are available.
