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

Explore Geographical Differences



London institutions hold a greater proportion of PG campus-based programmes, MBAs & Dual Degrees



Scottish institutions offer increased flexibility – greater share of online/distance programmes



Welsh institutions have a greater proportion of sub-bachelor qualifications

Analyse Specific Markets – e.g. Undergraduate Fast-Track Degrees

Popular at Alternative & Modern HEIs

Most common subjects: Education, Law, Business, Policing, Computing

Limited in availability (c300 total, 60% at APs)

Potential to increase International Fees

20% cheaper overall for Home students

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



Full-time Campus-Based Standard 180-credit



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Scholarships and Bursaries

More commonly a tuition fee waiver at PG level than at UG level


International awards more commonly a % fee waiver than for Home students

UG awards more likely to be university-wide, PG awards more likely to be at course-level

Merit-based scholarships more common at established universities

Specialist universities show greatest preference for courselevel awards Established have greater proportion for international, Modern have more focus on Home students










Top Individual Countries for International Awards

Subject/Course-Specific Awards - PGT



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
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

Around half of public nonspecialist universities list specific T-level requirements for 1 or more Bachelor degree courses.

4 Russell Group universities only mention T-levels to state they are not accepted.

Few list T-level requirements for ALL courses, as they are not relevant to all subjects.

Non-Health STEM courses have lower requirements




