BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

Cultivate your own global perspectives, business ethics, and problem-solving skills in APM in order to join the next generation of international business leaders.

The College of International Management is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB International), which is widely regarded as the highest level of accreditation for business schools worldwide. This means you will enjoy world-class instruction as well as have access to various exchange opportunities with our top business school partners across the globe.

As a student in APM, you will begin your studies tackling core management concepts and then branch out into your specialized field of interest. A capstone course during your last year will put you in real-time business discussions with company executives and challenge you to use essential business skills. You will also be encouraged to take part in business case competitions organized both on campus and internationally.

AREAS OF STUDY

INNOVATION AND ECONOMICS

Learn about what generates innovation, how production is managed, and the underlying economic foundations of these concepts. The lectures are geared towards those wishing to contribute to global development through business or policy-making.

MARKETING

The theories and methods needed to successfully provide goods and services to the global market is the focus of courses in the marketing area of study. You will learn to identify the most effective method to link production to the final consumer and determine how much to provide at what cost.

STRATEGIC MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATION

These classes focus on how to set goals, establish principles, and develop methods for an organization so that it meets the challenges of evolving social needs. If you aim to become an entrepreneur or plan to take over your family business, this area of study is ideal for you.

ACCOUNTING AND FINANCE

The health of corporations is evaluated by the ebb and flow of money, which is known as accounting, while finance is the field concerned with raising and managing the funds necessary for corporate activities. Classes in this area of study enable you to gain a solid foundation in these demanding fields and exercise your knowledge in an international context.



SEMINAR CLOSE-UP: CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY


Conducting business nowadays is more than just maximizing profits. Sustainability must also be considered, as it is not only vital to the global community and the environment but also to a business's success. A recent rise in awareness of such sustainability issues by various stakeholders not only draws positive attention to businesses that give back to society at large, but also is a factor for those seeking employment. Employees now favor organizations that manage with honesty and transparency while also having a positive impact on societal and environmental well-being.

In this class you will learn to think critically and analyze the current business landscape from the angles of social responsibility and sustainable management. We will review and discuss policies, initiatives, and practices by various businesses, and how these affect the different functions of a company, such as operation, sales and marketing, human resources, etc. This third-year seminar class is also designed to develop your research skills if you are aiming to write a thesis in your fourth year. As part of this process, I will guide you in finding your research question. I will also encourage you to view issues against various international dynamics and to determine how you can contribute to global society in a responsible and sustainable way.

As a piece of personal advice, I urge you begin developing competitive skills and professional value while you are still a student. After graduating from university, you will join the real world where organizations seek out those with unique talents and outstanding skills. Think about what you can offer that is different from others and what organizations would be willing to pay you for. Never stop evaluating, improving, and leveraging such competitive advantages. With this mindset, I am confident that you can succeed in becoming a respectable CEO, entrepreneur, consultant, leader of a multinational corporation, or any other role you endeavor to reach.

COLLEGE OF ASIA PACIFIC STUDIES [APS]

BACHELOR OF SOCIAL SCIENCE (BSocSc)

In APS, we challenge you to tackle a vast array of global issues and develop new ways of thinking to face these obstacles head on. You will gain a broad understanding of the political systems, economies, societies, and cultures of the Asia Pacific while gathering relevant skills in language and information technology. Between your second and sixth semester, you will be able to choose an area of study to specialize in and embark on more in-depth studies and research. APS prepares you for a wide variety of careers in government, international organizations, media, the travel industry, and multinational corporations.

AREAS OF STUDY

ENVIRONMENT AND DEVELOPMENT

Profit-driven development has brought with it a raft of environmental and other issues, and sustainable development is an urgent issue for our times. Lectures in this area of study tackle this question of sustainable development in relation to efforts to balance environmental conservation and economic development. You will also examine sustainable development policies in light of the systems and laws in each country and region.

HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM

As cultural exchange and promotion of regional industries through tourism are vital to the development of the Asia Pacific region, this area of study explores multiple facets of tourism through the lenses of culture, society, and community. You will focus on the theory and practice of hospitality management as it relates to the tourism, health, service, and welfare industries.

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND PEACE STUDIES

This area of study allows you to delve into the intricacies of conflict resolution and peace-building as well as to cultivate the ability to deal with increasingly complex global issues in order to become a future expert. Your studies will draw from the three disciplines of international law, political science, and economics and help you gain the necessary critical thinking skills and a policy-oriented approach to succeed in the fields of international relations, dispute resolution, and peace-building.

CULTURE, SOCIETY AND MEDIA

This area of study enables you to analyze the societies, cultures, and values of the Asia Pacific to deepen your understanding of the issues this region faces. Your coursework will include study on information technology, culture, and new media. Through this, you will gain a global perspective, fundamental media skills, and the ability to view the region from several angles.



SEMINAR CLOSE-UP: CULTURE, SOCIETY AND MEDIA

Most students who take my research seminar in Culture, Society and Media do so because they are interested in learning more after completing one of my lecture courses. These lecture courses provide a basis for further study as they focus on topics in education, history, and religion, and offer a multidisciplinary approach to understanding these topics by combining cultural studies, sociology, and media studies.

By joining this seminar you will explore your interests in Culture, Society and Media and, in a setting infused with the spirit of collective inquiry, you will pursue a full-fledged research project of your own design under my guidance. My goal is for you to make the transition from being students—where someone tells you what to study, when to study, why to study, and how to study—to independent learners, where you make these decisions for yourselves. At the end of the seminar, you will produce and present on an extensive piece of writing on a topic of your choice and in doing so, attain both public speaking and academic writing skills beneficial to a variety of careers.

The multidisciplinary outlook and skills that you acquire from my research seminar will enable you to qualify for graduate school in a wide range of fields, from cinema studies to sociology and beyond. Some of my former students obtained positions in the private sector, joining large international companies and small businesses both in Japan and abroad. Others entered the public sector, working for NGOs, NPOs, and educational institutions. A few students have also gone on to successful careers in music performance and media production, while one graduate recently entered medical school.

The sky is the limit for the achievements of Culture, Society and Media graduates, and I attribute this impressive array of outcomes to the combination of their social science and humanities knowledge and strong research skills developed in a supportive environment. Throughout your time with me at APU, I will encourage you to strive towards three overarching goals: develop a useful skill, learn the care of the self, and find your joy. I will also remind you that before you can shape your world, you need to fully understand it.

The two most valuable skills that I gained from this seminar class were to think critically and to write logically. I also learned that understanding how to construct and carry out independent research can lead one achieving to greater goals in life. This interest was fueled not only by my enjoyment of writing a thesis, but also through my part-time work at APU as a writing tutor, a language peer advisor, and a teaching assistant. Under the knowledgeable, meticulous, and caring supervision of Professor Progler, I not only gained knowledge in social, anthropological, and media studies, but also developed a mindset to view things holistically while simultaneously observing its details. I was happy that I became a more responsible person under his guidance.

CONNECTED BY LANGUAGE

Communication is the first step to international understanding, and language is one of the primary tools that makes it possible. A new language also brings a new mindset that enriches your perspective. Acquire another language through APU's language classes, and you will have a significant advantage in your future career whether it is based in your home country, Japan, or another location.

I have always had a hunger to learn languages and become a polyglot. So when the opportunity to attend APU and learn Japanese presented itself, I did not hesitate in seizing it. For me, Japanese is a different language—different, not difficult, being the keyword. With no prior background in Japanese, I started my studies with the sessions held at AP House to learn the *hiragana* and *katakana* alphabets during the new student orientation period. Once classes started, I took Japanese Foundation I, II, and III and then proceeded on to Intermediate Japanese. These were intense, but I noted a remarkable difference in my language skills from very early on. Having a part-time job in Beppu helped me as well as it served as a true language immersion experience; you are put in an

MASTER JAPANESE

As a student undertaking your studies in English, you are also required to take Japanese language classes as an essential component of your degree. Regardless of whether you have prior Japanese language training or not, we have all levels of classes from beginner to advanced, to suit your ability at enrollment. (The reverse applies to students studying their major in Japanese.)

BECOME MULTILINGUAL

If you aim to learn more than one language, APU offers additional language courses in the Asia Pacific languages of Chinese, Korean, Malay/Indonesian, Spanish, Thai, and Vietnamese. Raise your proficiency in these languages by participating in one of APU's language immersion programs available in several different countries around the world.

Out of all the Japanese phrases I know now, *wakarimashita* (I understand) is my favorite. This draws back memories of the early days when I couldn't understand a single word of Japanese. Now, being able to use this phrase gives me such a good feeling because it shows I understand the content of what is being said to me. I encourage you to never be afraid of mistakes when learning Japanese because this is how you improve and build up your skills.


NOT YOUR TYPICAL DORMITORY



ALUMNI JOURNEYS



After graduating from APU, I pursued my master's degree in professional accounting at the University of New South Wales in Sydney, Australia. After completing the program, I moved back to Tokyo, Japan and worked for a web advertising company for one year before I found a volunteering opportunity in Nicaragua. During my three months in Granada City, Nicaragua, I happened upon a cafe where all the staff were deaf, and that struck a chord in me.

I went on to Singapore to work as an equity analyst for Credit Suisse Singapore. But after experiencing that cafe in Nicaragua, I began to dream of opening a business which would provide income for people with disabilities, and so I started gathering the pieces to make this a reality. In 2015, I achieved my dream as Fingertalk Cafe was born. The cafe is located in Tangerang, Indonesia and not only employs deaf people, but also encourages its customers to learn sign language. I recently left my job at Credit Suisse Singapore to fully focus on this endeavor, which has now expanded into two cafes, a craft workshop, and a car wash service, with plans to expand even further.

APU gave me a lot of useful knowledge I have utilized in my various professional roles. The ability to speak Japanese well gave me an advantage in working with Japanese clients at Credit Suisse while my APM classes have been especially beneficial in current role as the founder of Fingertalk. I felt grateful for the classes I took at APU specifically to learn the foundations of such skills as effective team management, financial reporting, and fundraising. Additionally, APU's multicultural environment taught me to be adaptive and flexible to cultural differences. In my case this also includes "deaf culture" – another culture that I must understand in order to succeed.





Admission Fee

The admission fee is required for all students, regardless of scholarship amount, and is usually due within approximately four weeks after admission result notification. This fee is non-refundable under any circumstance.

Tuition

A partial payment of your first semester tuition is due in order to complete your enrollment procedures. The remaining tuition will be due at a later time. For APU Tuition Reduction Scholarship recipients, this amount will decrease based on the percentage awarded.

Comprehensive Renters' Insurance

This insurance is for protection in case of liability, and its fee is required from all students, regardless of scholarship amount.

AP House Entrance Fee


This fee is required for all students, regardless of scholarship amount. The fee includes a moving-in fee (32,000 JPY), security deposit (78,000 JPY), and rent (39,000 JPY per month) for two months for April enrollees and for one and half months for September enrollees.

LIVING EXPENSES

Living expenses for a year (including rent listed above) amount to approximately 900,000 JPY (approx. 7,826 USD).

SCHOLARSHIPS

APU awards Tuition Reduction Scholarships to outstanding international students. These cover 30%, 50%, 65%, 80%, or 100% of your tuition until graduation. You are eligible to apply if you will hold a student visa while studying at APU. Additional scholarships are available after enrollment. Scholarships at APU are primarily merit based.

- Complete the online application at <https://admissions.apu.ac.jp>
- Submit all required supporting documents (originals and certified copies) by post
- Pay the application fee by credit card or bank transfer
 - If you reside outside Japan: 5,000 JPY
 - If you reside in Japan: 35,000 JPY
- Wait for APU to screen your documents and contact you to arrange an interview
- Have an interview online, by telephone, or in person
(If you live outside Japan, it is not necessary for you to travel to Japan for your interview.)
- Receive screening results from APU by post and online

Your result notification will include both admission and scholarship screening results. If you are accepted to APU, you will be expected to submit additional documents by post and pay enrollment procedure fees. APU will apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) on your behalf via the Immigration Bureau using the documents you provide. With this certificate, you can apply for a student visa at your local Japanese embassy or consulate.
