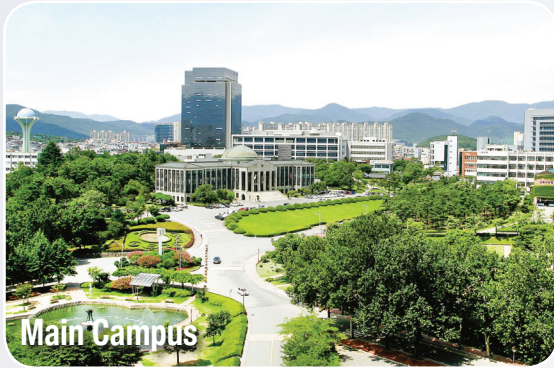

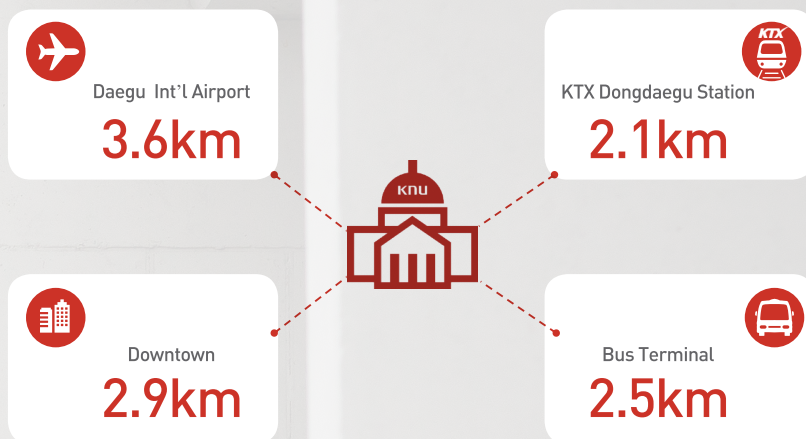

Sandwich Educational Program

The Sandwich Educational Program is a system created to help students maximize their professional experience in a certain period of time, while attending school. It allows students to familiarize themselves with hands-on company experience by placing them in real business situations according to their major or any field that they are interested in. From the student standpoint, the advantage of this program is that it grants them the opportunity to decide whether their chosen career path is suitable for them while allowing them to increase their professional adaptability. In addition, it can also include the benefit of gaining not only academic credits but also income from their practice allowance.

Job Plaza

The Job Plaza on the 4th floor of the Welfare Hall at the Student Union Building is the nation's largest facility for employment support. It is a one-stop service system established by integrating various employment institutions such as the Employment Support Division, Vocational Development Division, Center for Career Development of Female Students, and the like. Aiming to efficiently help increase the quality of employment among students, it offers some 1,140 employment-related newspapers and books, and runs an employment clinic program every week.

Smart System

The Smart system initiated in 2007 is a program that allows students to organize and record their self-development process, including their academic progress, international engagement, team activities, employability skills, and work experience. With support from professional advisors, students can build a personal development portfolio during their university life that will help realize their future career goals. A special record of achievement is presented upon graduation.

SCHOLARSHIP



Even though national universities have relatively low tuition rates, Kyungpook National University still provides its students with assistance to reduce the burden of their tuition fees. In fact, 64% of all enrolled students receive a scholarship from the university, which amounts to about 78.4 billion KRW per year in total.

and small gatherings organized by different university departments in various subject areas, such as literature, art, sports, academic lectures and so on.

KNU Global Program

Kyungpook National University is enhancing the foreign language abilities of students through various international exchange programs, and training global leaders with strong international competencies by providing students with the chance to become acquainted with countries and cultures around the world.

Dual Degree Program

This program allows students to complete two degrees while they are enrolled in a 4-year course at university. In addition to their KNU diploma, students can also receive a Bachelor's degree from Jilin University, Harbin Institute of Technology and Zhengzhou University in China; University-Missouri Columbia, South Dakota State University and University of Texas - Dallas, in the USA; Budapest University of Technology & Economics in Hungary; University of Warsaw, Warsaw School of Economics and Warsaw University of Technology in Poland; University of Ljubljana in Slovenia; ICN Business School in France, Ca' Foscari University in Italy, Northumbria University in the UK, Helsinki Metropolia University of Applied Sciences in Finland and Dublin Institute of Technology in Ireland.

Student Exchange Programs

These programs give students an opportunity to advance their degrees with recognized credits from foreign universities that have a exchange student agreement with KNU. It offers a unique educational opportunity in which students can further their studies and widen their international outlook through direct contact with advanced education and foreign cultures. Currently, we are sending students to 120 universities in such countries as the US, Canada, UK, Australia, Japan, China, and various other countries around the world

Overseas Internship Program

Kyungpook National University was the first University in Korea to send students overseas through foreign internship programs. Students sent to 40 countries such as the USA and Australia have been given unique opportunities to experience something special by working in various places, the most notable being a broadcasting station, the office of a House Representative, and secretarial offices of the UN Chief-of-Staff in Washington DC and New York City. This program allows students to experience onsite practical application of skills related to their major, local language and culture; and for which they receive the maximum of 36 academic credits.

Global Challenger Program

Kyungpook National University operates the Global Challenger Program, aiming to help students explore the educational field of developed countries through selected focal points related to their liberal arts curriculum and majors. Students can experience the policies, cultures, and industries of advanced countries, and have the opportunity to learn how to apply their majors to the development of society.

EU-ICI Program

The Ministry of Education (MOE) and the Delegation of European Union (EU) have chosen Kyungpook National University for the EU-ICI Project four times since 2009. KNU has sent its students to European countries as exchange/ Dual Degree seeking students through KNU's student mobility projects. The EU Committee and MOE support those students by covering some of the expenses. Through this program, it is expected that by 2016, about 258 EU and Korean students will have been overseas.

Overseas Volunteer Activities Program

The Overseas Volunteer Activities Program is typical of the kind of globalization program Kyungpook National University is famous for, sending about 200 students overseas every year as volunteers. Through this program students take part in volunteer activities such as cultural exchanges, support-labor volunteering, and the teaching of Korean language, computer skills and Taekwondo, in countries such as Vietnam, the Philippines, and other neighboring Asian countries. Students not only experience the international community but also learn to become warm-hearted leaders.

AEP Program

The KNU Language Institute runs a special Academic English Program (AEP) in partnership with the University of Texas at Austin, which focuses on Academic English, IBT TOEFL, and Cultural Knowledge; and helps to prepare KNU students for studying overseas. All successful participants receive a certificate from UT-KNU.

The College of Agriculture and Life Sciences is an education-based & research-oriented college creating a high-value biotechnology industry through the convergence of traditional and state-of-the-art technology (BT, IT, ET, GT and CT). It fosters outstanding, globally oriented talent through its competitive academic courses that pioneer in the field of life health industries, and contributes to the creation of advanced technologies in fields of green environmentalism and future-oriented agro-food life sciences.

Now the college publishes approximately 436 articles annually in SCI journals.

As one of the top public administration programs in South Korea, the KNU School of Public Administration is proud of its high national ranking, as shown in the public administration school rankings in Korea by JoongAng Daily Newspaper in 2005. The program ranked 2nd for educational atmosphere, 5th for alumni reputation, and 6th in the Higher State Examination.

The College of Veterinary Medicine aims to train competent professionals who serve in various areas such as veterinary medicine, medicine, public health, and biological science, contributing to the welfare of humankind as well as the nation. It was first established as the Agricultural Veterinarian Medicine department in 1954. It was later upgraded to the Veterinary Medicine department at the College of Veterinary Medicine, before finally being restructured from a 4-year program to a 6-year program in 1998.

Originally founded in 1974, it became the School of Dentistry in 2005, and was re-established as the College of Dentistry in 2015. The 2010 National Report on Schools of Dentistry in Korea showed KNU to be one of the best in education and research in the field of dentistry. The mission of the KNU College of Dentistry is to educate outstanding dentists who can contribute to dental science by providing the best oral health service to the community, while maintaining humanity and humility through the pursuit of self-development.

KNU's Master's Program was established in 1956 with 40 doctorate enrollees. Since 2014, the general graduate school has offered Master's Degrees in 5 fields, with 84 departments, 20 school-research-industry joint programs, and 19 inter-departmental joint programs. PROFESSIONAL GRADUATE SCHOOLS

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

Over the past 80 years, KNU has produced about 7,755 highly skilled doctors and medical scholars. In 2006, the KNU Medical College was transformed into the KNU School of Medicine. In 2009, the medical school established its own boarding residence, and opened the 2nd Chilgok hospital in January 2011, providing more advanced education to students. In 2015, the new College of Medicine was established. Approximately 200 professors provide our students with basic/clinical medical training, allowing them to make the most of their majors and conduct world-class research projects by acquiring off-campus research grants totalling more than 10 billion KRW per year. Students can receive clinical medical education at Kyungpook National University Hospital and its affiliated hospitals, and also experience medical training in overseas advanced medical institutions.

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

The school of Dentistry has produced 2,000 dental experts in the 16 years since its first graduation ceremony in 1980. It is the only provincial college to have conducted large-scale national policy-based research support programs such as BK21 and Medical Science Research Center projects together. Currently 41 full-time professors and 150 foreign professors serve as faculty members. The school is located separately in the central part of Daegu Metropolitan City area, and is fully furnished with advanced laboratories and lecture rooms, a dental clinic with state-of-art medical equipment and facilities, dormitories, and a student welfare center, providing students with an excellent education environment. In 2015, the new College of Dentistry was established.

LAW SCHOOL

The KNU Law School was established in March 2009, when the law school system was first adopted in Korea. The school has a faculty consisting of professors who are also legal practitioners and experts in related theories. Facilities include a moot-court, state-of-the-art lecture rooms and an exclusive high-tech library furnished with 80,000 law books. In addition, the school conducts exchange programs with renowned law schools in the US, China, Japan and other countries. The programs of the law school at KNU are focused on producing lawyers with exceptional professionalism and international competitiveness through the installation of an in-depth elective track in consideration of enrollees with a wide range of majors and backgrounds.
