

Academic year

The academic year is divided into two semesters for most students (some students, e.g. nursing, have a longer academic year). The first semester runs from September until mid-January and the second from late January to May.

Each semester comprises 12 weeks of teaching followed by an exam period. Full-time students will typically study three modules in each semester (18 modules of study make up a standard three-year degree programme). Most modules are assessed through coursework and/or exams. The first semester exams are in early January and the second semester exams are in May.

Lectures, seminars and tutorials

Teaching is delivered through lectures, seminars and tutorials, and sometimes practicals and fieldwork. Lectures are formal teaching sessions, often with a larger group of students. Seminars, which usually provide a form of follow-up to lectures, take place in smaller groups and are often used to promote group discussion about a specific topic. In tutorials, a small number of students meet with a tutor to discuss work and to raise points of particular interest or difficulty.

Work placement or study abroad

You may have the opportunity to go on work experience or study abroad during your third year. For some medical-related courses, you will be required to undertake block work placements throughout the course.

Investing in Your Future Career

Our learning experience is career-focused and relevant, offering a range of opportunities to enhance your CV and stand out to potential employers. This ensures that you graduate with the knowledge, skills and confidence to make your mark in a competitive job market.

Career planning

Our Career Development Centre team offers friendly and impartial advice to help you plan your career and provides a range of opportunities designed to enhance your employability. You will have access to job vacancies, placement opportunities and vacation or part-time work. We also organise regular fairs and forums where you can meet employers and professional bodies.

Professional accreditation

Most of our degree programmes are developed in collaboration with industry and professional bodies. Many also offer an additional professional qualification or accreditation, something you will find invaluable once you graduate.

Work experience

At Ulster, most full-time undergraduate and integrated Master's degrees include a period of work-based learning. You also have the opportunity to build your international profile through work experience abroad.

If you successfully complete a placement year in employment, you could be awarded a Diploma in Professional Practice (DPP) or a Diploma in Professional Practice - International (DPPI) if your employment is overseas. Alternatively, you could be awarded the Diploma in International Academic Studies (DIAS) if you complete a placement year studying abroad.

Giving you the EDGE

Employers are placing more emphasis on recruiting graduates who not only have a degree, but who are also equipped with key transferable skills. The Ulster EDGE Award provides official recognition for activities undertaken outside of your studies. It is awarded in addition to your degree and gives you the opportunity to engage in a wide range of activities that will boost your career prospects and show commitment to your personal development.

Higher Education Achievement Report

The University provides a Higher Education Achievement Report (HEAR) to all full-time students upon graduation. It is a detailed record of your academic and extra-curricular achievements to supplement your degree. The HEAR allows you to showcase your achievements to employers and postgraduate tutors; hear.ac.uk

Campus Life Jordanstown

Belfast's Cathedral Quarter is the artistic and cultural centre of the city and home to our Belfast campus. If you choose to study here in Northern Ireland's capital, you can take advantage of its wealth of culture and entertainment.

Ulster's art and design heritage dates to the establishment of the School of Art and Design in 1849. Although traditionally associated with art, the campus spans an increasing and exciting range of subjects including architecture, hospitality, Irish language, event management, photography and digital animation.

Facilities include purpose-built design spaces, studios for recording and editing live and off-air television, sound recording, mixing and animation, teaching and exhibition areas as well as a library. Our vibrant campus plays host to frequent fashion and art exhibitions and is an exciting place to study and work.

The Belfast campus is continuing to expand and develop as part of one of Northern Ireland's largest urban developments.

Our bustling Jordanstown campus is the largest of Ulster's campuses and is located just seven miles north of the city on Belfast Lough.

The campus has a strong profile in business, engineering, computing, social sciences, communication and academic disciplines relating to the science and coaching of sport. Sport plays a significant part in the life of the campus.

It is home to the Sports Institute of Northern Ireland (SINI), a partnership between the University and Sport Northern Ireland, and most of Northern Ireland's leading athletes train here at our impressive facilities.

Buildings are structured around a central 'mall' allowing students to walk from one end of the campus to the other without going outside. The mall area is home to banks, restaurants, coffee shops, sandwich bars, a supermarket, the Chaplains' Office and the Students' Union.

The main building is surrounded by lawns and trees and is just a few hundred metres from Loughshore Park. We also have a complex of student accommodation on campus for students choosing to live a little closer.

Campus Life Magee

Campus Life Coleraine

The friendly village atmosphere of our Magee campus offers an intimate learning environment in the heart of Northern Ireland's second city, Derry~Londonderry. As part of the Magee community you will receive excellent support and enjoy a full social life.

Magee is synonymous with creativity; it is home to Ulster's School of Creative Arts and Technologies and creativity runs through every programme. Teaching strengths include business, creative arts, creative technologies, computing, engineering, nursing, Irish language and literature, social sciences, law, psychology and peace and conflict studies.


The beautiful, leafy campus comprises a mixture of historical and new buildings and is dominated by the main building – known by some students as 'Hogwarts' due to its impressive Gothic architecture. Magee College was opened in 1845 as a centre for arts and theology at the bequest of Martha Magee, the widow of a Presbyterian Minister. This magnificent building was opened in 1865 and remains the hub of the campus.

The famous walled city centre and the River Foyle are a short walk from the campus. Located in the North West of Northern Ireland and a short distance from County Donegal, Derry~Londonderry is ideally situated for exploring some of Ireland's most dramatic landscapes.

The feeling of community at our Coleraine campus makes for a warm and welcoming student experience. The relaxed, outdoor atmosphere of the north coast is reflected in the feel of this thriving campus.

A wide range of subjects are available at Coleraine, which makes for an interesting mixture of students and staff. Subject areas include biomedical sciences, environmental science and geography, psychology, business, the humanities and languages, media and journalism, travel and tourism, teacher training and computing.

The campus sits on the banks of the River Bann, less than a mile from the town centre. Coleraine town is the largest and busiest on the Causeway coast. Together with the nearby seaside towns of Portrush and Portstewart and the Giant's Causeway World Heritage Site, this area is a major international tourist destination and has an excellent selection of bars, clubs and awardwinning restaurants. For those interested in outdoor activities, the local beaches, coastline and hills provide great opportunities to get outside and explore.





Distance Learning

Ulster University's eLearning programme is well established and we offer one of the most comprehensive distance learning provisions in the UK across undergraduate, postgraduate and part-time courses.

More than 4,000 students from over 50 countries have successfully completed our distance learning programmes to date.

Our eLearning students are very much considered part of the Ulster University family and have access to the same facilities and services available to all students

We constantly evolve our curricula in this area and introduce new courses, such as the first postgraduate degree in health psychology to be offered by distance learning of any university in the UK or Ireland.

Accommodation

To help you settle into university life, international students are guaranteed university accommodation if your application is submitted before the end of July. In fact, some of our students like our accommodation so much they live with us for their entire programme of study.

University-managed accommodation is reasonably priced, clean, comfortable and modern. We offer 2,400 places across, and in the vicinity of, our four campuses. Ulster University, Belfast

If you are studying at the Belfast campus you can apply to live in university accommodation at the Jordanstown campus. There are excellent rail, bus and taxi links between these campuses. Alternatively, you may consider private accommodation.

Ulster University, Jordanstown

Most of the accommodation in our on-campus student village comprises five-bedroom, en-suite apartments with high-speed broadband and WiFi connections with shared kitchen/dining facilities. If you require a bigger space you can rent self-contained apartments on-campus.

We provide adapted accessible accommodation for students with disabilities. There are a few houses and apartments available on-campus which have a shared bathroom facility and kitchen/living/dining areas between five or six residents.

Ulster University, Magee

We offer accommodation for over 630 students in our student village and our halls of residence, Coppin House, both less than five minutes' walk from the campus. All accommodation has access to high-speed broadband with WiFi throughout. There are self-contained units available for students who require additional space, privacy and independence. Adapted accessible accommodation is available for students with a disability.

Ulster University, Coleraine

Our student village offers fantastic on-campus accommodation. Most rooms have en-suite facilities and all have a broadband connection and access to the internet with WiFi throughout. There are some suites available for students with special or mobility needs. Students seeking more independence may choose to live in leased accommodation in the nearby seaside town of Portstewart. The University allocates and manages this accommodation.

Making the Most of Student Life

- O1 Uncover the myths and legends surrounding The Titanic:

 Titanic Belfast is the largest museum in the world dedicated to the infamous liner. Situated on the Harland and Wolff shipyard where the doomed vessel was built, the museum consists of nine interactive spaces and includes original Titanic artefacts and a replica of the ship.
- O2 Take a "paranormal" tour of the Crumlin Road Gaol:
 Crumlin Road Gaol first opened its doors to Belfast's mad, bad and dangerous in 1846 and served as a working prison until 1996. Daytime, evening, Victorian and even "paranormal" tours now take place at the gaol, which has seen 17 men executed during its 150-year working history.

03 Wander through the Botanic Gardens:

Established in 1828, the city's Botanic Gardens are the perfect spot to get away from the hustle and bustle of city life. With a number of walking routes, a Palm House, tropical ravine and rose garden, this is the perfect spot to laze around in when the sun comes out.

04 Eat, drink and dance in the Cathedral Quarter:

Belfast is comprised of several "quarters" of which the Cathedral Quarter is probably the liveliest. It's packed full of bars and some quality eating spots and on a weekend, the pubs are usually full by lunchtime, so you'll need a strong constitution if you want to keep up with the locals.

05 Treat your taste buds and expand your culinary

One of the greatest adventures of studying abroad is exploring new food and flavours and there is nowhere better to treat your taste buds than St George's Market, one of the best markets in the UK and Ireland. With 250 traders there's something for everyone with arts and crafts, vintage artefacts, unique gifts and tasty food and beverages too. The market is open every weekend and hosts a range of events throughout the year.

06 Enjoy a gin in one of the mightiest Victorian gin palaces in Ireland:

Dating back to the 1880s, The Crown is a gem of the Victorian era. Formerly known as The Liquor Saloon in Great Victoria Street, Belfast this ageless and priceless pub was one of the mightiest Victorian gin palaces in the city, and still boasts many of its original features, including gas lighting.

07 Sayour a Guinness:

Ireland is famous for it's Guinness and all over the world people often speak wistfully of the increased quality of the black stuff once you hit the Emerald Isle – and it's absolutely true. Ireland's national drink is served pretty much everywhere and it's a delight.

08 The Troubles:

You can't escape the fact that Belfast is a divided city. There are peace walls and security gates dividing staunch Catholic and Protestant areas with political murals across the most loyally defended parts of the city. There is nothing quite like this anywhere else in Europe and taking a bus or walking tour to see and hear about the background to the artworks is an absolute must.

09 Ulster Museum

Located in the Botanic Gardens, this museum hosts an eclectic mix of exhibits and galleries, many of which you can interact with. As well as a decent collection of Irish art, you'll come across everything from dinosaurs to treasures recovered from an old Spanish galleon.

10 Listen to some live music:

The birth place of musicians like The Undertones, Ruby Murray and Van Morrison Belfast's vibrant pub culture thrives on live traditional music. There's never a shortage of musicians playing a range of Irish and folk music, original work and covers of traditional songs. The city literally hums with live music 7 nights a week. Some of our favourite spots include The Dirty Onion, Fibber Magee's and The John Hewitt.

Top 10 Derry~Londonderry.

01 Wander the walls

You should linger around Derry's city walls – the only completely intact city walls in Ireland, they stand 26 feet high and 30 feet wide. Your walk will take in all the main sights, including four sets of original gates and 24 original cannon. Don't miss the famed 'Roaring Meg'.

02 Visit The Guildhall

The Guildhall is a striking building located in the heart of the city. Fashioned in neo-gothic style, it was originally built in 1887 by The Honourable The Irish Society. The red sandstone building is of neogothic architecture, with Tudor overtones. The Guildhall contains stunning examples of stained glass windows and visitors will be intrigued by its unique history and appeal. The staircase, main hall organ and corridors give a fascinating insight into this distinctive building.

03 Step into Heaney's HomePlace

Immerse yourself in the world of the most widely published poet in the English language. Go on a journey through the Nobel Laureate's life, his experiences, and the people that inspired his poetry. County Londonderry was a major inspiration to the late Seamus Heaney, and now the Heaney HomePlace is a must-go for literary fans and the curious alike.

04 Join in the Carnival at the best Halloween destination in the world

Halloween's origins date back over 2,000 years to the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (sow-in), when, according to tradition, the ghosts of the dead returned to walk the earth before a new year began for the Celts on 1 November. At Derry's Halloween carnival you can expect fireworks and Jack-o'-lantern competitions and thousands and thousands of people in fancy dress.

05 Take to the Tower

The Tower Museum is spread over five floors and its uppermost level gives stunning panoramic views of the Walled City and River Foyle. Immerse yourself in the city's past with the Story of Derry Exhibition and An Armada Shipwreck – La Trinidad Valencera, the story of the Spanish Galleon that sank of the Donegal Coast in 1588.

06 Instagram Free Derry Corner

Delve into Londonderry's rich and complex history with great Instagram moments at the iconic Free Derry Corner gable wall and the city's famous walls. Take a guided tour and hear all about the famous 105-day siege of 1688. Explore the histories of the time at the Siege Museum and Museum of Free Derry.

07 Millennium Forum

One of Northern Ireland's premier theatres and conference centres and is one of the largest purpose-built theatres in Ireland. They have a vibrant range of arts and entertainment events on offer throughout the year. With its stunning entrance and marble floored Italian-style Piazza, it promises a wonderful night's entertainment in sumptuous surroundings in the historic Walled City.

08 The Nerve Centre

A focal point for youth culture in Derry, the Nerve Centre brings popular music, film, video, animation and interactive multimedia together under one roof.

09 Peadar O'Donnell's

Done up as a typical Irish pub/grocery (with shelves of household items, shopkeeper's scales on the counter and a museum's-worth of old bricabrac), Peadar's has rowdy traditional-music sessions every night and often on weekend afternoons as well.

10 The Peace Bridge

Opened in 2011 the Peace Bridge, is a walkway & cycle bridge across the River Foyle. It crosses the river from behind the Guildhall to the former Parade Ground at Ebrington Barracks – linking the Walled City to the new developments at Ebrington and St. Columb's Park. Illuminated at night the Peace Bridge is a major landmark in the city.

Top 10 Causeway Coast.

01 Marvel at the Giant's Causeway

Catch the beautiful narrow-gauge heritage train on the Giant's Causeway & Bushmills Railway route and arrive in style at the iconic hexagonal stones. Take in the amazing visitor centre and experience the power of the mighty Mr Finn McCool. Clues of his existence including the Giant's Boot and Wishing Chair – lie all around.

02 Get on the Game of Thrones trail

Re-live scenes or stand in the spots where the blockbuster TV series was filmed. Be sure to see the mysterious Dark Hedges, the foreboding Cushendun Caves and picturesque Ballintoy Harbour. For gossip and behind-the-scenes tales, talk to the locals or book a tour.

03 Surf Atlantic waves

The quintessential County Antrim water-sport experience is to surf the waves on a ride towards the beautiful white chalk cliffs of Whiterocks Beach. Powerful waves are around much of the year at this exposed beach break, within walking distance of Portrush which is only one stop on the train from our Coleriane Campus.

04 Walk Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge

Once you dare to walk the Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge, remember there's only one way back to collect your National Trust certificate. Yes, you'll have to do it again. But it's so worth it. You will be hard pushed to find better scenery and natural beauty on the island, an old salmon fishery that you cross to.

05 Sail away to Rathlin Island

Escape to another world on Rathlin Island via the ferry from Ballycastle across the Sea of Moyle. Take a tour of the upside down lighthouse built into a cliff face, and enjoy isolated walks, tranquil nature and one of the largest seabird colonies in the UK. You might even spot some seals.

06 See the sunset at Dunluce Castle

When the sun's rays are low over Dunluce Castle, your iconic snap of the Antrim coastline is waiting to happen. This evocative castle lost its kitchen when it fell into the sea one stormy night. Its stories, together with those of the nearby abandoned village of Dunluce, still being uncovered by archaeologists, are well worth exploring.

07 Taste the finest Irish whiskey

Bushmills was one of the first distillery's in the world to make both single malts and blended whiskeys. Tours run daily allowing you to enjoy the heat and the smells as you take a guided tour through the still actively working Old Bushmills Distillery on the banks of the River Bush. They will leave you ready for a great tasting experience at the end.

08 Drive the iconic Causeway Coastal Route

You need a day or two or a long weekend to really delve deep into the iconic Causeway Coastal Route by car. It runs through unrivalled scenery and links ancient castles, amazing geological formations, golden beaches and picturesque seaside towns and villages. Cycling it brings amazing sights and challenges too, such as the dreaded steep ascent of Torr Head.


09 Explore Carrickfergus Castle

You can't run out of adventure and stories at the impressive Carrickfergus Castle – there's 800 years of history to absorb in what is one of the most important and best documented medieval castles in the whole of Ireland. It's well worth seeing the keep, the banqueting hall, medieval life exhibits and the collection of cannons that once formed part of the defences.

How do I apply?

If you are applying through a partner institution, your home institution must nominate you. Nominations should be emailed to the Study Abroad Team, **studyabroad@ulster.ac.uk**. If you are applying independently, as an occasional student, please also contact the Study Abroad Team for further details. If you are applying through a study abroad provider you should use their application form and follow their procedures.

What are the entry requirements?

You must be enrolled at an overseas university and have completed at least one year of study at your home institution. You must also have a GPA of 3.0 (on a scale of 4.0) or equivalent to apply. If English is not your first language please ensure that you meet our English language requirements.

Is there a deadline for applications?

Key dates are provided below. Applications are considered on a rolling basis until the application deadline.

Semester 1 (Fall) or full academic year

Semester 2 (Spring)



How should I write my personal statement?

Your personal statement is an opportunity for you to 'sell' yourself and a vital part of your application. We want you to clearly demonstrate your interest in the subject area that you are applying to. Here are some things that you should include:

Past achievements and interests and how these relate to your application.

Key skills and abilities you have which you can use and develop as part of your studies.

Any relevant work experience (including voluntary).

Your career aspirations and how your studies will contribute to this.

Is there an English language requirement?

If English is not your first language, to study with us you must be able to demonstrate that your English language competency is of a standard suitable for succeeding in your chosen course of study. As part of your application, you will be required to provide an English language proficiency test, which must be no more than two years old by the time of commencing your studies. Most of our courses require you to have a minimum of IELTS 6.0 (with no contributing band less than 5.5).

If your English language proficiency does not meet our requirements, our Centre for English language Teaching offers a range of English language courses, which are designed to prepare international students with the necessary language skills for academic study at Ulster University. Applying to Ulster University

Entry Requirements

Undergraduate entry requirements

The minimum required to be considered for entry to our undergraduate programmes is the equivalent of three A-levels at CCC. However, some programmes will require higher grades and particular subjects.

Competence in written and spoken English is a General Entrance Requirement for entry to all courses, with some courses also requiring specific arades for mathematics.

Each programme will have slightly different requirements, both in terms of overall points and certain subjects, so it is always best to check the relevant subject in the undergraduate on-line prospectus at **ulster.ac.uk/courses**

Postgraduate entry requirements

Typically, we require applicants for taught programmes to hold the equivalent of a UK first degree (usually in a relevant subject area). Please refer to the specific entry requirements for your chosen course of study as outlined in the online prospectus; ulster.ac.uk/courses

Normally the minimum English language entry requirement is IELTS (academic) of 6.0 (with no band score of less than 5.5).

Postgraduate research/PhD entry requirements

You will need to have a First or Upper Second Class Honours degree (or equivalent) in an area relevant to your chosen project to be able to apply for our research degree programmes.

What if I don't meet the English language requirements?

The Centre for English Language Teaching (CELT) at Ulster University offers a range of English language programmes designed for international students to improve your understanding and knowledge of the language. The programmes combine academic study, intensive English language preparation, study skills and cultural orientation.

Pre-sessional English Language Courses

Ulster University offers a range of Pre-sessional English language courses designed to enable you to reach the entry level of your chosen degree.

The Pre-sessional English language programmes are designed to develop your study skills in English language and prepare you for further study with us.

Depending on your English language ability there are two programmes to choose from, Pre-sessional PLUS or Pre-sessional Standard. Pre-sessional courses are designed for international students who have a conditional offer for an undergraduate or postgraduate degree from us but who have not yet met our standard English language entry requirement of an overall IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent. The programmes, which are delivered by staff with considerable experience and expertise, will teach you to learn the necessary skills for university study, improve your English language ability and academic presentation techniques.
