KU ISC embraces a global student body by offering the program to both international and domestic Korean students. Through educational experiences in and out of the classroom with prominent international scholars, students enhance their academic knowledge and personal development. Each year, more than 1,600 students participate in KU ISC from 230 universities in over 40 countries from around the world.

Cultural Experience 2

Experience Korea's unique culture outside the classroom! All KU ISC students are given opportunities to participate in field trips to Gyeongbok Palace, Lotte World Amusement Park, and a Buddhist Temple Stay every Friday. There are no extra charges for the field trips. Also, to ensure that students are comfortable in their new surroundings, KU student volunteers or "buddies", support students by organizing social and cultural activities helping them to make the most of their experience in Korea and at KU.

Certificate Program 3

Along with one-day field trips, KU ISC offers cultural immersion courses on Friday mornings. Students who complete one of the courses will be given a certificate issued by KU ISC. 04 KU ISC Program

KU ISC has two types of programs, 6-week program and 4-week program, which differ in their duration and length. The only differences between the two programs are the Program Period, Class Time, and Number of Courses. All students may choose among courses from the 4-week and/or 6-week program.



With all the teaching hours of a regular 16-week academic course, KU ISC offers over 100 courses across a wide range of disciplines condensed into only 6 weeks. Students may earn up to 9 credits (3 courses) during the 6-week program.



KU ISC is now offering a special 4-week course track program. This program is designed for both those who are not able to participate in our standard 6-week program or those that would like to combine a 4-week track course with a 6-week track course.

06 KU ISC Pre-College Program

KU ISC Pre-College is an unique program of the International Summer Campus designed to allow high school graduates to experience college life. Following general education program models developed by US Ivy League institutions, students will gain a head-start in their university life by attending introductory, university-level courses taught by renowned scholars and participating in a variety of cultural activities.

▶ ELIGIBILITY

- Current high school students in good academic standing
- High school graduates who never attended college-level institutions

▶ COURSES

Pre-college students are entitled to choose up to three courses among all KU ISC courses (p.12-p.15). Students may contact KU ISC directly regarding detailed course information. Please note that it is not guaranteed that credits earned at KU ISC are transferable to students' future home institutions. The academic authorities of the home institutions will assess credit transferability of a particular course based on their policies.

08 Courses

▶ COURSE REGISTRATION

Below is the list of courses offered during KU ISC 2016. Students may take up to three courses. Depending on student demand and instructor availability, some courses may be cancelled or added. Students must pre-register for courses from the following list, although they may adjust their course schedule once they arrive. All classes have a limit of 50 students. If the minimum enrollment of ten students is not reached, a course might not be available. Those who are late in pre-registration may not be able to enroll in the classes they wish to take.

▶ COURSE INFORMATION

Classes are held from Monday to Thursday (150 minutes per class for 4-week program/100 minutes per class for 6-week program) and each class carries three credits. There is no difference in quality or content between the 4-week and 6-week program courses. All classes are conducted in English except for Korean Language courses.

Students' academic performance is assessed based on four different criteria: exams, assignments, attendance, and class participation. Each professor, however, may prefer a different performance policy, students should follow the professor's guidelines in such cases. ► CREDIT TRANSFER

Students who wish to have KU ISC course credits transferred to other colleges and universities are advised to consult with the appropriate academic authorities at their home institution, in advance, by showing our course syllabi posted online. Home institutions' academic advisors make the final decision on whether a particular KU ISC course may be applied towards the major or elective requirements at the home institution.



11 Internship

KU ISC offers students a number of internship opportunities at various companies or institutions in Korea. For the last few years, students have interned at prestigious organizations including the National Assembly of South Korea, Arirang TV and Hyundai Motor. This valuable internship experience allows students to earn resume credentials for their future careers and build an international social network.

Eligibility

Students who are currently enrolled and have attended at least two semesters at their home university/college at the time of application with a written letter and minimum GPA of 3.0/4.5 (or equivalent).

※ Internship is a part of the KU ISC program. Program fees will not be fully refunded if you cancel the KU ISC program during or after the internship.

Evaluation

Students who receive passing evaluations after the internship will be issued a completion certificate and credits based on their working hours. Please note that if you fail or drop out of the internship, you will be disqualified from applying for any scholarships.

▶ WITHDRAWAL & REFUND POLICY

Withdrawal is defined as the dropping of a student's entire academic program. The application fee (KRW 100,000) is NOT refundable unless a course is cancelled. All other remaining tuition and fees will be 100% refunded before the start date (June 27th, 2016). If a student withdraws during the first week of classes (by June 30th, 2016), only 80% of tuition and dormitory fees will be refunded. No refund will be given after June 30th, 2016 under any circumstances.

▶ VISA REGISTRATION

It is the student's responsibility to be issued the correct type of visa in advance at the Korean Embassy or Consulate Office. Nationals of countries or regions where Korea has signed a visa waiver agreement may enter Korea without a visa. However, students from countries which are excluded from the visa waiver agreement program must apply for a visa on their own. Since the duration of KU ISC is six weeks, you may need to apply for a short term stay visa. Obtaining a visa may be time-consuming and therefore we encourage students to apply early.

※ Chinese nationals whose home institution is outside of China MUST apply for a visa in the place where their home institution is located.

▶ KU HOUSING

Students may apply for accommodations in either CJ International House or Frontier House. Please note that CJ International House has limited room availability.

※ All students may freely choose their length of stay at KU Housing from 4 weeks to 6 weeks regardless of type of enrollment.

TRADITION Palace Quarter

Gyeongbokgung Palace was the first royal palace built in the Joseon Dynasty and where the Joseon Dynasty's 500-year-history began. The largest of the five grand palaces remaining in Seoul, Gyeongbokgung provides a glimpse into Joseon's royal culture and architecture through the Geunjeongjeon and other structures. The National Folk Museum of Korea and the National Palace Museum are also located on the palace grounds.



SHOPPING Myeongdong

Korea's best-known shopping district, where the streets are lined with department stores and shops that sell brand-name cosmetics, clothing, and shoes. The Myeongdong area is home to many flagship department stores and shopping malls where you will have access to hundreds of stores specializing in fashion, accessories, and more.



FUN Hongdae

How many courses can I take?

You may freely choose to take either 1, 2 or 3 courses (3 credits per course) for the KU ISC program.

How can I change the course registration?

Students may change/add/drop courses anytime by logging into our website <http://isc.korea.ac.kr> before the deadline (June 30th, 2016). After the deadline, however, you will not be able to add or drop any courses.

How do I know which level of Korean language courses I should take?

A Korean language proficiency test will be given on the first day of class, on June 28th. Registered students will be notified of the test schedule on the notice board of our website.

How quickly do you process the KU ISC applications?

KU ISC applications are processed within one week of receiving the completed application form with the non-refundable application fee of KRW 100,000, and official transcript from your home institution. On receipt of payment, we will confirm your place at KU ISC. The letter of acceptance will be sent immediately upon your acceptance to the program.

What is the difference between the International Summer Campus and the Korean Language and Culture Center?

The Korean Language & Culture Center focuses solely on Korean language education and culture exchange programs during the summer, whereas the KU ISC provides diverse credit-bearing academic courses, which are transferable to all major universities. The medium for all lectures at KU ISC is English, excluding Korean language courses.

How can I find out the status of my application and payment?

You may visit our website and select view/change your application under the registration menu.

Can I take the internship program only?

No, the internship is part of the KU ISC program and only students who are fully registered will be given an opportunity to apply.

What if I arrive late for the program?

All the students are expected to be present for the first day of the program. However, if you cannot arrive for the first day of your class, you must notify your professors of your proposed arrival date and obtain permission for late arrival. Professors' contact information is on the syllabi of their courses on the KU ISC website.
