ON-CAMPUS FACILITIES

Libraries With 2.4 million volumes, NTU's Main Library is the largest university library in Taiwan. It has a large multimedia center and 24-hour self-study room, providing the perfect place for students to prepare for class or do research.

Sports Facilities The NTU Sports Center consists of a swimming pool, a gym, badminton and squash courts and more. Outside facilities include basketball, volleyball and tennis courts, and a running track and outdoor swimming pool.

Health Center NTU has an on-campus health center providing discounts to NTU students for health-related services.

Career Center The Career Center provides information and services for career planning and employment.

Student Counseling Center The Student Counseling Center helps promote students' mental health and psychological well-being.

FREE CHINESE LANGUAGE COURSES

DEGREE PROGRAMS

NTU offers 282 degree programs at the bachelor’s, master’s, and PhD levels, with an ever-increasing number of programs and courses taught in English.

ELIGIBILITY

Foreign nationals applying to NTU are divided into International Students, Overseas Chinese Students, Hong Kong and Macau Students, and Mainland Chinese Students. The application process, tuition fees and available degrees may differ depending on student identities.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

It is required to provide a certificate of enrollment or graduation, transcripts of the highest degree received, recommendation letters, statement of purpose and language certificates, as well as other materials as required by the department you apply to.

TUITION FEES AND PROGRAM DURATION

Tuition fees and duration vary from college to college. For graduate degrees, full tuition fees are paid during the first two years, and a basic tuition fee for every following semester.

NON-DEGREE PROGRAMS

Students looking to spend a short time at NTU can apply for one of NTU’s non-degree programs.

EXCHANGE STUDENT PROGRAM

Each year, NTU welcomes around 1500 international students from partner universities to take part in NTU’s Exchange Student Program, benefitting from NTU’s internationally regarded quality, unique educational environment and friendly community. The Exchange Student Program lasts one semester to one academic year, and students must be nominated by their home university.

VISITING STUDENT PROGRAM

The Visiting Student Program is a fee-paying program designed for outstanding current students of overseas universities who wish to broaden their horizons while earning credits at NTU. Students in this program receive the same benefits as exchange students.

RESEARCH VISITING PROGRAM

The Research Visiting Program is designed for students enrolled in overseas academic institutions who are interested in conducting a short-term internship or research with an NTU faculty member. While research visiting students can make use of NTU’s academic resources, they cannot enroll in courses, and on-campus housing cannot always be guaranteed.

NTU PLUS ACADEMY

NTU Plus Academy enables students to experience the local customs and the rich natural ecology of Taiwan, gaining further insights into traditional and modern society in several fields of study. The program offers courses taught by distinguished faculty in Chinese or English. These courses allow students to earn academic credits and enjoy cultural immersion. Through a series of field trips and cultural activities, students gain in-depth knowledge about the different environmental, historical and sociocultural aspects of Taiwan.

LIFE IN TAIWAN

NTU is located in Taipei, the capital of Taiwan. In such a modern and international metropolis, students will have no trouble getting used to life, and NTU provides information and assistance where necessary.

ON-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION

All Overseas Chinese, Hong Kong, Macau and International degree, exchange and visiting students are guaranteed on-campus accommodation.* The rental fees vary per dormitory.

VISA AND ALIEN RESIDENCE CERTIFICATE (ARC)

Overseas Students planning to study in Taiwan for longer than 90 days need to apply for a Visitor or Resident Visa at the Taiwan Diplomatic Mission in their country of residence. Those students staying for a year or longer can apply for an ARC which allows them to apply for NHI and a work permit.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (NHI)

Taiwan’s public health care, the NHI, is famous around the world. Exchange, visiting and degree students who are studying in Taiwan for one year or more are eligible to enroll in NHI after their first half year in Taiwan, which will give students access to affordable and quality health care. For the first half year before enrolling in NHI, NTU offers to enroll degree students into Group Medical Insurance.

WORK OPPORTUNITIES

During your time studying at NTU, you will have many opportunities to work with faculty on research on the national and international level, do internships, or engage in other work relevant to your studies. For paid work students must apply for a work permit.
