Applicants are reviewed individually and holistically to ensure consideration is given to factors included in an applicant's composite achievement profile including;

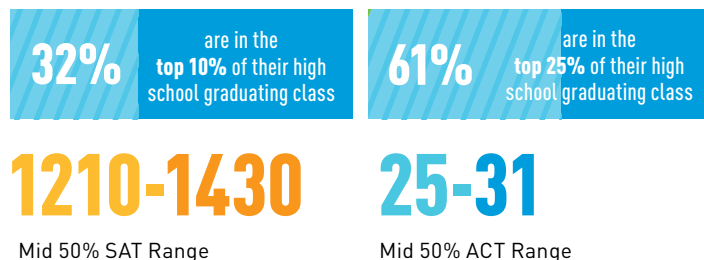
- Overall grades in academic coursework and trends in achievement.
- Strength of high school curriculum, including level of rigor (AP, IB, dual credit).
- High school rank and GPA.
- SAT or ACT test scores.
- Ability to be successful in intended major.
- Information provided in the résumé, essay and/or letters of recommendation.

Texas Top 10 Percent

Applicants graduating in the top 10 percent of their class from an accredited Texas high school who successfully earn the Distinguished Level of Achievement can qualify for automatic admission.

All first-time college freshmen admitted to UT Dallas by March 1 are automatically reviewed for an Academic Excellence Scholarship (AES) award. Cost

*Tuition projections are based on 30 hours (15 hours per semester) beginning fall 2017. Oklahoma residents pursuing their first undergraduate degree pay the Texas resident tuition rate plus \$30 per credit hour.

Financial Aid

For students interested in joining our academic community, cost should not be a barrier to reaching their goal. UT Dallas participates in all federal and state need-based financial aid programs, including grants, loans and work-study.

Transfer Admission

All transfer students must be in good academic standing at the last college attended, regardless of the number of transferable semester credit hours.

Assured Admission | utdallas.edu/enroll/transfer

Applicants are eligible for assured transfer admission if they meet one of the following criteria:

- 42 or more transferable credit hours with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (no more than 90 attempted hours).
- A Comet Connection member with a completed AA/AS/AAT and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Qualify for admission under section 51.8035 of the Texas Education Code. Please see utdallas.edu/enroll for more information.

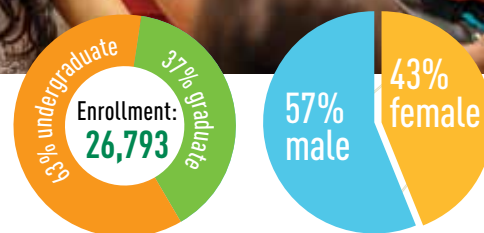
