# Our Graduate School

## Graduate Centres

We have five Graduate Centres based on different campuses and from different discipline areas. These centres are exclusively for postgraduate students and early career researchers and provide access to a range of development activities.

The centres have study and social areas, networked computers, seminar rooms and access to kitchen facilities. They are also a hub for networking between postgraduates and help promote a sense of community. We also have Graduate Schools at our campuses in China and Malaysia, which you can use should you spend any time there.

## Flexible paid placements

Postgraduate Placements Nottingham offers paid placements with a range of employers from small local businesses to multinational organisations. These placements are open to all postgraduates and are designed to fit in with your studies and give you the opportunity to learn transferable skills and enhance your employment prospects during your postgraduate studies.

## Researcher Development Programme

We deliver core training in line with the standards set out by the UK's major research funders through our Researcher Development Programme. This means that as well as helping you to develop your research skills, you will have access to training opportunities spanning communication skills, careers, time management, and entrepreneurship – and the chance to meet and work alongside researchers from other disciplines.

If you wish to present your research overseas or spend time researching abroad, the Graduate School offers a number of competitive financial awards. # Funding your potential

## Tuition fees

All postgraduate students pay an annual fee which covers registration, tuition, initial examination, graduation, access to most of the University's library and IT services and membership of the Students' Union.

Tuition fees for 2017/18 entry are listed next to each course on pages 28-69. The fee you pay depends on the course you are on and whether you are classified as a home, EU or international student. Fees quoted are per session, which means from 1 August to 31 July of the relevant academic year, or the full duration of a one-year masters course. Please refer to our webpages for PGDip/PGCert fees.

Part-time fees are normally charged according to the proportion of study undertaken during the year. For example, if you study half of a one-year course, you will normally be charged half of the full-time fee. A definitive list of all postgraduate fees is published on our website.

Tuition fees are included in our course listings and were correct at the time of going to print. You should check the University's website for the correct course information, entry requirements and fees before you decide to apply for and accept a place on the course:

## Funding

When looking at how to fund your postgraduate studies, it is worth taking the time to research your options as there may be opportunities available to you in relation to your area of interest.

Please note that funding applications are usually completed by the spring before you start studying in the autumn.

## Loans

The UK government has introduced a new system of postgraduate loans for certain students undertaking taught and research masters degrees in the UK. These were introduced in 2016 and can provide up to £10,000 in total across all subject areas (subject to eligibility criteria). You may also want to consider a Professional and Career Development Loan, which you can take out from most high street banks to help you cover the cost of fees and living expenses.



# Our campuses

**Combining beautiful parkland and countryside, impressive traditional and modern architecture, along with cutting-edge learning and research facilities, our award-winning campuses are inspiring places to live, work and study.**

## University Park Campus

One of the most beautiful campuses in the UK, the 300-acre landscaped site is set around a boating lake. With outstanding sports facilities, libraries, art galleries, two theatres, a museum, recital hall, hotel, health centre, hair salon, two banks and a student bar, it really is the hub of student life. It's hard to believe this wooded oasis, with wildflower meadows and secret gardens, is just 10 minutes by bus or tram from the bustling, cosmopolitan city centre.

## Jubilee Campus

The campus has won numerous awards for its environmentally friendly design, including receiving Green Flag award status every year since 2013. Futuristic architecture, a library in a lake, eco-friendly buildings and innovative technologies combine to create unique surroundings. And you can't miss the Aspire sculpture, one of the tallest free-standing public works of art in the UK.

## Sutton Bonington Campus

Set in beautiful countryside 10 miles south of University Park, Sutton Bonington is home to our Schools of Biosciences and Veterinary Medicine and Science. It has state-of-the-art plant and food science laboratories, a commercial farm and dairy centre alongside a library, halls of residence and a sports centre.

## Healthcare sites

The University has strong links with hospitals across Derbyshire, Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire, meaning we can offer placements in many specialisms.

Our Medical School is situated in Queen's Medical Centre (QMC), directly opposite University Park Campus. From here you can also access Nottingham City Hospital via a free bus which hosts our Division of Physiotherapy. If you choose to study Graduate Entry Medicine or Graduate Entry Nursing, you will study at our purpose-built site at The University of Nottingham Royal Derby Hospital Centre.

# Accommodation

**We guarantee all new postgraduate students University-arranged accommodation for one year to help make your move to Nottingham as simple and stress free as possible.\***

## University-arranged accommodation

We have six accommodation sites that are well-placed for easy access to all our campuses as well as local amenities and the city centre. You can choose from single study bedrooms in shared flats to en-suite self-contained studio apartments. All flats have a fully fitted kitchen, dining facilities and Wi-Fi. There are security teams dedicated to each site, a management team and a student committee that organises events and activities at each of our sites, providing a safe and comfortable environment.

## Accessible living

If you have a disability and need accessible accommodation, we will do all we can to provide the access and facilities you need. We urge you to inform us as early as possible, as students with specific requirements must be considered according to priority and availability.

## Couples and family housing

If you intend to come to university with your partner or family, you can apply for one of a limited number of places in University houses or you can find suitable housing in the private sector.

## How to apply

You can apply for accommodation online at [www.nottingham.ac.uk/accommodation](http://www.nottingham.ac.uk/accommodation) from **1 March 2017** onwards if you are due to begin your studies in September 2017. You will need to accept your course place before you can apply for accommodation. The deadline for applications is **1 August 2017**.

## Academic English preparation and support

The University's Centre for English Language Education (CELE) provides high-quality preparation and English language support before and during your studies.

If you want the best English language and study skills preparation for your future academic course, you can attend an academic English preparation course. You can progress through four English for Academic Purposes stages, depending on your language level. Courses range from 5-40 weeks long with start dates throughout the year.

CELE offers specialist summer courses for students going on to study business, architecture and built environment, engineering and law. There is also a four-week programme which runs in August for students who already have an unconditional offer and would like to refresh their study and language skills.

Students at the centre can take part in a variety of activities, such as conversation practice, cultural exchanges and quizzes.

# Doctoral Training Programmes

As a world-leading research institute, The University of Nottingham has a broad portfolio of fully funded Doctoral Training Programmes, many of which are cross-disciplinary.

Each one offers specialist opportunities for PhD and doctoral students through the delivery of integrated and tailored high-level research and skills training. Each opportunity is unique, with some offering placements, but all provide cutting-edge doctoral study, combined with a supportive and exciting working environment.

The University of Nottingham has attracted significant funding of £162m from research councils and industry partners to develop programmes which aim to produce the next generation of research leaders across a range of disciplines.

Unless stated otherwise, all existing studentships are for UK and EU students who have been resident in the UK for at least three years. Currently Research Council funding can cover fees for EU students but eligibility for stipends may vary.
