ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- For the majority of postgraduate taught courses, a 2:1 honours degree or international equivalent is required.
- Many postgraduate research degrees will also require a master's degree or international equivalent for entry.

For course-specific entry requirements, please check your course details online before you apply to ensure you meet the full entry requirements.

STUDENT VISA FINANCE CONDITIONS

If you require a student visa to study in the UK, you must have sufficient funds to cover both fees and maintenance (for yourself and any dependants in the UK). UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) requires you to demonstrate that you have access to a minimum amount of money to cover living costs.

The amount changes regularly, so always check the UKVI website for the most up-to-date information. If you have dependants you will have to show that more funds are available.

We would also recommend that you have access to more funds than this in order to cover all costs and any emergencies that may arise.

STUDENT VISA FINANCE CONDITIONS

To gain permission to enter the UK as a student from outside the European Economic Area, it is likely that you will need to apply for a Tier 4 visa. You will not be able to apply for your visa until you hold an unconditional offer from King's. Once your offer is unconditional, King's will provide you with a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number, which you need in order to apply for your Tier 4 student visa.

When applying for a visa, you are required to show that you have a minimum amount of money to cover tuition fees and living costs for both you and any dependants, and this must remain in your bank account (or your parents' account, but additional documents may be required in this case) for a minimum of 28 days prior to the date of your visa application. This amount of money cannot drop at any point during this period.

In addition to this, we would recommend that you have access to additional funds in order to cover all costs and any emergencies that may arise.
