The VNU-School of Law (VNU-LS) always attaches great importance to forming and developing a partnership for academic exchange, joint research, education and training, and experience sharing with many prestigious agencies, organizations, and institutions from France, Belgium, England, Germany, USA, Canada, Australia, Denmark, Sweden, Russia, Japan, Korea, China, Taiwan, Laos, Thailand, Indonesia, etc.

Moreover, the VNU-LS has cooperated with international partners to organize several international joint training programs at graduate and undergraduate levels, such as the Vietnam - Japan Bachelor's program in law from 2004 to 2014 (coordinated with JICA) and the Master's program in International Business and Economic Law from 2001 to present (collaborated with three prestigious French universities: Bordeaux 4 University, Toulouse Capitole 1 university and Jean Moulin Lyon 3 university)

Pioneering programs in legal training in Vietnam implemented by the VNU-LS also received support and collaboration from foreign partners such as the Master's Program in Human Rights sponsored by Center for Human Rights of the Faculty of Law, University of Oslo (Norway), by the Danish Government and currently by the Australian Government; The Master's Program in Good Governance and Anti-Corruption funded by the UK and Ireland government.
