



Biology student Olivia Lutfallah didn't set out to become a TikTok sensation. Her goal was to use social media to educate people about ADHD—a diagnosis she received in grade school. Today, with 300,000 followers and counting, she posts on topics such as "How my ADHD brain works," "Productive procrastination" and "ADHD school survival tips."

This last topic is one she's particularly passionate about: "Accommodations aren't an unfair advantage, they level the playing field between me and neurotypical students," says Olivia. Working with her professors and Western support services, Olivia receives the accommodations she needs, including wearing noise-cancelling earplugs, having extra time on her assignments and writing her tests and exams in a separate room.

With these supports, Olivia is thriving in her studies while using her personal story to normalize neurodiversity one post at a time.



In addition to his involvement in the University Students' Council (USC) and his faculty students' council, Matthew was selected as Western's 2022–2023 Student Writer-in-Residence the only program of its kind in North America.

In this role, Matthew encourages aspiring student writers to engage with one another. "I'm really excited about pulling our writing community together," he says. "Writing can be a very solitary exercise. We writers often work in silos. I think that's a missed opportunity to exchange ideas and learn from each other."

Matthew's debut novel Until We Break, which he wrote during his time at Western, was published to rave reviews in fall of 2022. The young adult novel explores the themes of grief, mental health, racism and art.



Like many students, Favour Okpali didn't know exactly what career she wanted. But she did know she really liked math and science. Deciding to take a leap of faith, she enrolled in the engineering program at Western and hasn't looked back since.



English Requirements

Part of ensuring you are successful as a Western student includes making sure your English skills are strong enough for you to understand and enjoy your courses.

If English is not your first language, you must provide proof of your proficiency in listening, speaking, writing and reading English. Typically, this is done through an official test or English as a Second Language (ESL) program. You are encouraged to write a test at the earliest possible date and must have written before March 2024. Scores for any test written before January 1, 2022, will not be accepted.


